1	CUTTACK ..	Inches Nil	15 $\frac{3}{4}$	15 $\frac{3}{4}$	Weather seasonable. Its effect on agricultural operation favourable and on crops beneficial. Lands are being ploughed and manured for next year's crops. Harvesting of <i>jhain mung</i> and castor nearly over and that of <i>dalua</i> paddy still continues. Sugarcane thriving. Vegetables growing well. Fodder and water sufficient. Cattle-disease reported from Banki and Baideswar police-stations. Common rice is selling at 15 $\frac{3}{4}$ seers a rupee at Jajpur, at 18 $\frac{3}{8}$ seers at Kendrapara and at 17 $\frac{3}{8}$ seers at Angul.
2	BALASORE ..	0.07	14	15	Rainfall at Bhadrak 0.10 inch. Weather seasonable. Ploughing and manuring of paddy fields going on. Sugarcane and vegetables thriving well. No cattle-disease reported. Common rice selling at 16 seers a rupee at Bhadrak.
3	PURI ..	Nil	17 $\frac{1}{8}$	15 $\frac{3}{4}$	Weather seasonable. Sugarcane thriving. Paddy being thrashed. <i>Dalua</i> paddy thriving, earing, ripening and being harvested at places. <i>Mandua</i> , <i>china</i> , <i>biri</i> , linseed and <i>mung</i> being harvested. <i>Til</i> in fruit. Fodder and water sufficient. No cattle-disease reported. Common rice selling at 18 $\frac{3}{8}$ seers a rupee at Khurda.
4	SAMBALPUR ..	Nil	15 $\frac{3}{4}$	15 $\frac{3}{4}$	Weather seasonable. Manuring and improvement of fields continue. Cattle-disease reported from Mura, Barapali, Bheran, Sohella, Melchhamunda, Padampur, Paikmal, Bhatli, Ambabhona, Gaisilat thanas. Common rice selling at 15 $\frac{3}{8}$ seers a rupee at Bargarh. Report from Nawapara not received.

5	GANJAM	Rainfall at Possara 0.10 and at Mohana 0.10 inch. Water-supply insufficient for drinking in parts of Surada and Kudala Taluks. Sufficient for drinking only in Rasullkonda, Aska and G. Udaigiri. Sufficient for drinking and agriculture in Berhampore, Baliguda and Phulbani. Pasture available. Fodder sufficient. Conditions of men and cattle generally good. Labour available. Stock of food-grains sufficient. Prospects generally fair. Reservoir in Russalkonda 29.60 feet and at Surda 16.60 feet. Agency paddy first sort 1.75, second sort 1.46, boiled rice 2.92, raw rice 4.73, <i>ragi</i> 1.31, horse gram 2.69, salt 3.48. (Prices are given in rupee and decimals of a rupee to two places for imperial maund of 3,200 tolas). Common rice, Combu and Karkatch salt selling at 12, 15 and 8 seers a rupee, respectively, at Phulbani.
6	KORAPUT ..	Nil	12 $\frac{2}{3}$..	Water scarcity in parts of Parlakimadi Taluk and sufficient elsewhere. Sugar-cane sown in parts of Rayagada and Parlakimadi Taluks. Harvesting of sugar-cane concluding in Gunupur and Parlakimadi Taluks. Pasture available. Fodder sufficient. Condition of cattle generally good. Public health normal. Cholera at G. Udaigiri Parlakimadi Taluk. Labour available. Wages normal. Stock of food-grains sufficient. Prospects normal.

GENERAL SUMMARY :—During the week under report light rain fell in Balasore and Ganjam districts. There was no rain in the rest of the province. Threshing of winter rice is still in progress in Puri. Harvesting of *dalua* paddy continues in Cuttack and Puri. Sugar-cane is thriving. *Jhain mung, mandua, china* and linseed are being harvested. Preparation of fields for next season's crops is going on. The price of common rice remains stationary in Cuttack and Balasore as compared with that of last week. The average price of local common rice at the headquarters markets was 15.38 seers. The supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient except in parts of Ganjam and Koraput districts where scarcity of water is reported. Cattle-disease is reported from two districts.
