1	CUTTACK ..	3.78	13 1/8	13 1/8	Rainfall at Jajpur 2.26, at Kendrapara 3.75 and at Angul 3.35 inches. Weather seasonable. Its effect on agricultural operations favourable and on crops beneficial. Transplantation of <i>saradh</i> paddy continues. <i>Biali</i> , sugarcane, Jute, <i>arhar</i> , <i>til</i> and cotton thriving. Vegetables doing well. Fodder and water sufficient. Cattle disease reported from Jagatsingpur police-station. Common rice selling at 13 1/8 seers a rupee at Jajpur, 15 1/4 seers at Kendrapara and 14 11/16 seers at Angul. Weather favourable for Jute. Sowing finished. Plants healthy. Height about 3 feet. No damage by flood, etc.

Common rice selling at 13 seers a rupee at Bhadrak.

4	SAMBALPUR ..	Inches. 5.82	14	13½	Rainfall at Bargarh 3.37 and at Nawapara 3.06 inches. Weather cold and cloudy. <i>Bihura</i> and transplanted operations continue. Common rice selling at 13½ seers a rupee at Bargarh and at 12 seers at Nawapara. Cattle disease reported from Mura, Dhama, Barpali, Bhatli, Melchhamunda, Jagdalpur, Nawapara and Komna thanas.
5	GANJAM ..	0.31	Rainfall at Balliguda 2.42, at G. Udayagiri 1.49, at Phulbani 3.47, at Khejuripara 3.37, at Phiringia 2.57, at Russellkonda 1.64, at Surada 0.88, at Aska 0.35, at Kudala 0.57, at Berhampur 0.53, at Gopalpur 0.93, at Purushottapur 1.34, at Posara 2.58, and at Daringabadi 2.22 inches. (Prices in rupees and decimals of a rupee to two places per Imperial Maund of 3,200 tolas). Common rice selling at 10½ seers a rupee at Khondmals. Water supply sufficient for drinking and agricultural operations in all taluks. Transplantation of paddy proceeding in all taluks and that of ragi in Ghumsur and Berhampur taluks. <i>Kuhuri</i> , <i>ragi</i> , maize and redgram in Baliguda taluk, <i>samai</i> , paddy and maize, in G. Udayagiri taluk; sugarcane in Khondmals; sugarcane, gingelly in Ghumsur taluk; gingelly, <i>sua</i> and redgram in Surada taluk; sugarcane, gingelly and elephantyam and ragi in Aska taluk; paddy and ragi in Kudala taluk; ragi, gingelly, <i>kongu</i> and <i>jonna</i> and redgram in Berhampur taluk—extents appreciable—condition fair. Harvest— <i>Sua</i> and ragi in Berhampur taluk—outturn 12 and 8 annas respectively—Condition fair. Elephantyam in Aska Taluk—outturn 8 annas. <i>Samai</i> in Ghumsur taluk—outturn 4 annas. Pasture available. Fodder sufficient. Condition of men and cattle generally good. Labour available. Stock of food-grains sufficient. Prospects fair. Reservoir at Russellkonda 44.80 feet and at Surada 28.00 feet.

6	KORAPUT	Inches. 3-00	Rainfall at Nowrangapur 2-00 and at Rayaghada 2-51 inches. Weather cloudy and favourable to agricultural operations. Transplantation of paddy proceeding in four taluks, completed in two taluks. Sugarcane, paddy, <i>ragi</i> , redgram, <i>sama</i> , groundnut thriving generally. <i>Ragi vada</i> harvested in Parlakimedi taluk. Water sufficient. Fodder available. Cattle disease in Malkanagiri taluk. Stock of food grains sufficient. Prospects normal. Jeypore exporting rice. Common rice selling at 13 seers a rupee at Jeypore and 10 seers at Gunupur and Parlakimedi.

GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the province. The fall was heavy in parts of Puri and Sambalpur districts and light to moderate elsewhere. Transplantation of paddy is going on. *Bialai* paddy, *Mandua* and maize are in ears in the Puri district. *Ragi* is being harvested in Ganjam and Koraput districts. The condition of the Jute crop is reported to be healthy and fair in Cuttack and Balasore districts. Sugarcane is not thriving in the Balasore district owing to excessive rain. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 13-06 seers a rupee. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Cuttack, Balasore, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.
