Weather and Crop Report of Orissa for the week ending the 3rd August, 1936

GENERAL SUMMARY.--During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the province. The fall was heavy in parts of Puri and Sambalpur districts and light to moderate elsewhere. Transplantation of the province of Puri and Bandada Mandua and maize are in cars in the Puri district Transplantation of paddy is going on. Bialai paddy, Mandua and maize are in cars in the Puri district Ragi is being harvested in Ganjam and Koraput districts. The condition of the Jute crop is reported to be nealthy and fair in Cuttock and Beleave districts. Sugarcano is not thriving in the Balasore district healthy and fair in Cuttack and Balasore districts. Sugarcane is not thriving in the Balasore district owing to excessive rain. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 13.06 teers a tupee. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Cuttack. Balasore Sambalaur and Koraput districts.
