General Summary.—During the week under report rain fell in all districts of the Province. The fall was heavy in parts of Cuttack, Puri, Ganjam and Koraput districts and light to moderate elsewhere. Transplantation of saradh paddy is in progress. Harvesting of beali paddy, mandua and maize continues at places in the Cuttack district. Jute is being harvested in Cuttack and Balasoro maize continues at places in the Cuttack district. Jute is proceeding in Aska and Berhampur taluks of districts. Sugarcane is thriving. Harvesting of ragi is proceeding in Aska and Berhampur taluks of the Ganjam district. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 13.22 seers a rupee. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Cuttack, Balasore, Puri, Sambalpur, and Koraput districts.
