GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report there was practically no rain in the Province. The harvesting and threshing of *laghu saradh* paddy continue. *Guru saradh* paddy is ripening and its harvesting has commenced at places. The harvesting and pressing of sugarcane are going on. Transplantation of tobacco continues in the Cuttack district. Sowing of mustard and turmeric is going on in the G. Udayagiri taluk of the Ganjam district and that of *mung* in the Puri district. Cotton is in pods. Harvesting of *ragi*, redgram, blackgram, greengram, gingelly and sama are proceeding in Koraput district. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice is 18.87 seers a rupee against 18.53 seers for the preceding week in North Orissa and stationary at 15.67 seers in South Orissa. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Puri and Sambalpur districts.
