GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report there was no rain in Cuttack, Balasore and Puri districts. Harvesting and threshing of *laghu saradh* paddy continue. *Guru saradh* paddy ripening. The paddy crop is exceptionally good. Pressing of sugarcane continues in Puri district. Cotton is in pods. *Biri*, *kulthi* and mustard are in flowers. Vegetables are doing well. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice is 18.60 seers a rupee in North Orissa against 15.24 seers for the preceding week. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Cuttack and Puri districts. Reports from Sambalpur, Ganjam and Koraput districts have not been received.
