1	CUTTACK ..	Inches. 3.39	13 1/8	14 7/16	Rainfall at Jajpur 5.49, at Kendrapara 4.95 and at Angul 1.28 inches. Weather seasonable. Its effect on agricultural operations favourable and on crops beneficial. Transplantation of <i>Saradh</i> and weeding of Jute and <i>Biali</i> going on. Sugarcane thriving. <i>Mandia</i> being transplanted. <i>Arhar</i> , Til and Cotton being sown. Vegetables doing well. Cattle disease reported from Banki, Jagatsingpur and Mahakalpara police-stations. Fodder and water sufficient. Common rice selling at 13.1/8 seers a rupee at Jajpur, 15 3/4 seers at Kendrapara and 14.11/16 seers at Angul. Weather not so favourable for the Jute crop. The heavy rainfall in June last retarded the growth of the crop. Condition and growth of the plant were not satisfactory at the beginning. Now improving. No damage. Height of river lower than last year.

Cattle disease reported from Sadr and Bhadrak. Fodder and water sufficient. Common rice selling at 13 seers a rupee at Bhadrak. Weather not favourable for Jute. Average height 3'-6".

4	SAMBALPUR ..	Inches. 3.71	13	13	Rainfall at Bargarh 3.27 and at Nawapara 2.34 inches. Weather seasonable. Sowing and transplantation of paddy continues. <i>Bihura</i> operation commenced. Condition of sugarcane, etc. good. Cattle disease reported from Laikera, Sadr, Barpali, Bhatli, Jagadapur and Nawapara thanas. Common rice selling at 13½ seers a rupee at Bargarh and at 12 seers at Nawapara.
5	GANJAM ..	0.61	Rainfall at Belliguda 2.68, G. Udayagiri 0.15, at Phulbani 1.13, at Phiringia 2.13, at Khejuriapara 1.99, at Balandapara 3.74, at Russellkonda 1.49, at Aska 4.51, at Kudala 1.15, at Berhampur 1.24, at Daringabadi 1.24, at Posara 1.35, at Gopalpur 2.21, at Purushottapur 4.47 and at Rambha 1.50 inches. (Prices in rupees and decimals of a rupee to two places per Imperial Maund of 3.200 tolas). Common rice selling at 10½ seers a rupee at Khondmals. Water supply sufficient for drinking and agricultural operations in all taluks. Sowing of paddy in Berhampur taluk, transplantation of paddy in all other taluks, except Berhampur taluk; and transplantation of <i>ragi</i> in Ghumsur and Aska taluks are in progress. <i>Samai</i> , paddy and maize in G. Udayagiri taluk—extents appreciable—condition fair. Sugarcane progressing in Khondmals. gingelly in Ghumsur taluk—extent appreciable—condition fair. Sugarcane, gingelly and elephantyam in Aska taluk—condition fair. Ragi, gingelly, Kangu, red gram and <i>sua</i> and <i>Jonna</i> in Berhampur taluk—extents except ragi, appreciable—condition good. Harvest of elephantyam in Aska taluk progressing—Outturn 8 annas. Pasture available. Fodder sufficient—Condition of men and cattle generally good. Labour available. Stock of food grains sufficient—Prospects fair. Reservoir at Russellkonda 38-30 feet and at Surada 27-30 feet.

6	Koraput	Inches. 2.66	Rainfall at Nowrangapur 3.32 and at Rayaghada 4.85 inches. Weather cloudy. Favourable to agricultural operations. Sowing of paddy proceeding in parts of Malkanagiri taluk completed in four taluks; transplantation commenced in four taluks. Paddy, ragi, <i>Sama</i> , sugarcane thriving in six taluks. Water sufficient. Fodder available. Cattle disease in Parlakimedi and Malkanagiri taluks. Stock of food grains sufficient. Prospects normal. Parlakimedi importing, Jeypore exporting rice. Common rice selling at 14 seers a rupee at Jeypore and ten seers in Gunupur and Parlakimedi.

GENERAL SUMMARY:—During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the province. The fall was heavy in parts of Cuttack, Balasore and Puri and light to moderate elsewhere. Transplantation of paddy is going on. Weeding of Jute and *Biali* is going on in Cuttack district. Condition of Jute is fair in Balasore. Sugarcane is doing well. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 12-48 seers a rupee. Cattle-disease is reported from parts of Cuttack, Puri, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.
