GENERAL SUMMARY:—During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the province. The fall was heavy in parts of Cuttack, Balasore and Puri and light to moderate elsewhere. Transplantation of paddy is going on. Weeding of Jute and Biali is going on in Cuttack district. Condition of Jute is fair in Balasore. Sugarcane is doing well. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 12-48 seers a rupee. Cattle-disease is reported from parts of Cuttack, Puri, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.
