1	CUTTACK ..	3.91	15 $\frac{3}{4}$	15 $\frac{3}{4}$	Rainfall at Jajpur 1.95, at Kendrapara 1.96 and at Angul 1.74 inches. Weather seasonable. Its effect on agricultural operations not favourable and on crops favourable. The Mahanadi and Kathjori rivers are in floods. Prospects of crop and outturn fair. Cattle-disease is reported from Angul. Fodder and water sufficient. Common rice selling at 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ seers a rupee at Jajpur and 15 $\frac{3}{4}$ seers at Kendrapara and Angul.
2	BALASORE ..	6.07	12	12	Rainfall at Bhadrak 3.34 inches. Broadcast sowing of paddy hampered on account of heavy rains. Sugarcane and vegetable damaged by flood. No cattle-disease is reported. Common rice selling at 13 seers a rupee at Bhadrak.

Fodder and water sufficient. No cattle-disease is reported. Common rice selling at 15 $\frac{1}{8}$ seers a rupee at Khurda.

4	SAMBALPUR ..	Inches. 13.62	13	13	Rainfall at Bargarh 5.58 and at Nawapara 3.59 inches. Weather cloudy. Sowing of paddy continues. Cattle-disease reported from Nawapara thana. Common rice selling at 13½ seers a rupee at Bargarh and 13 seers at Nawapara.

(Prices in rupees and decimals of a rupee to two places per imperial maund of 3,200 tolas.) Common rice selling at 10½ seers a rupee and salt 8 seers at Khondmals. Water-supply sufficient for drinking and agricultural operations in all taluks. Ploughing of land in progress in Khondmals; sowing of paddy in Balliguda, G. Udayagiri, Ghumsur, Aska, Kudala, Chatrapur and Berhampur taluks, of <i>ragi</i> in Balliguda and Ghumsur taluks, of redgram and Kuhuri in Balliguda, of Samai in G. Udayagiri and of sugarcane and gingelly in Ghumsur taluk, is in progress. Transplantation of paddy in G. Udayagiri and of sugarcane in Aska is continuing. Sugarcane is thriving in Khondmals; sua, gingelly, kangu, jonna, redgram and <i>ragi</i> in Berhampur taluk. Extents appreciable except for <i>ragi</i> . Condition fair. Gingelly and sua in Surada taluk. Extents appreciable. Condition fair. Samai and paddy plants in G. Udayagiri—extents appreciable. Condition fair. Pasture available. Fodder sufficient. Condition of men and cattle generally good. Labour available. Prospects fair. Stock of food-grains sufficient. Reservoir at Russellkonda 33.10 feet and at Surada 25.10 feet.

6	KORAPUT ..	Inches. 6.15	Rainfall at Nowrangpur 9.62 and at Rayaghada 3.14 inches. Weather cloudy, favourable to agricultural operations. Sowing of paddy is proceeding, transplantation in three taluks. Sowing of <i>ragi</i> and <i>sama</i> is proceeding. Sugarcane thriving in five taluks. Fodder and water sufficient. Cattle-disease is reported from Malkanagiri. Prospects normal. Stock of food-grains sufficient. Paralakimedi importing large quantities of rice at selling price. Common rice selling at 14 seers a rupee at Jeypore and 10 seers at Gunupur and Paralakimedi.

GENERAL SUMMARY :—During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the province. The fall was heavy in parts of Balasore, Puri, Sambalpur, Ganjam and Koraput districts and light to moderate elsewhere. Cuttack rivers in flood. Sowing of paddy is in progress though retarded to a great extent or hampered in Puri and Balasore districts. Transplantation of paddy is continuing in parts of Ganjam and Koraput districts. Sugarcane and vegetables in Balasore damaged by flood. Sugarcane thriving in Puri and parts of Ganjam and Koraput districts. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 14.12 seers a rupee. Cattle-disease is reported from parts of Cuttack, Sambalpur and Koraput.
