Its effect on agricultural operations favourable and on crops beneficial. Weeding of <i>biali</i> and transplantation of <i>saradh</i> paddy continuing. Jute, sugarcane, cotton, <i>arhar</i> , and <i>til</i> thriving. Vegetables doing well. Condition of the crops improving. Cattle disease reported from Jagatsingpur police-station. Fodder and water sufficient. Common rice selling at 13 1/8 seers a rupee at Jajpur, 15 1/4 seers at Kendrapara and 14 11/16 seers at Angul. Weather favourable for Jute. Sowing finished. Growth healthy. Height 2 1/2 to 3 feet. Height of river lower than last year.

Common rice selling at 13½ seers a rupee at Bargarh and at 12 seers at Nawapara.

Transplantation of paddy in all taluks, and of <i>ragi</i> also in Ghumsur and Aska taluks is in progress. <i>Kuhuri</i> , <i>ragi</i> , maize and redgram in Baliguda taluk, <i>samai</i> , maize, paddy in G. Udayagiri taluk—extent appreciable—condition fair. Sugarcane progressing in Khondmals. Gingelly in Ghumsur taluk—extent appreciable—condition fair—sugarcane, gingelly and elephantyam in Aska taluk—extents appreciable—condition fair, summer ragi, sua, gingelly, kangu, <i>jonna</i> and redgram in Berhampur taluk—extents appreciable—condition fair. Harvesting of elephantyam in Aska taluk—outturn 8 annas. Sua in Berhampur taluk—outturn 12 annas. Pasture available, fodder sufficient. Condition of men and cattle generally good. Labour available. Stock of food-grains sufficient. Prospects fair. Reservoir at Russellkonda 41.75 feet and at Surada 28.25 feet.

6	Koraput ..	Inches. 9.79	Rainfall at Nowrangapur 13.78 and at Rayaghada 6.54 inches. Weather cloudy. Favourable to agricultural operations. Rivers and streams in flood. Sowing of <i>vooda</i> and <i>chana</i> completed in Bissomkatak taluk, harvested in Parlakimedi taluk. Transplantation of paddy proceeding and concluded in two taluks. Sugarcane thriving in four taluks. Water sufficient. Fodder available. Cattle disease in parts of Parlakimedi and Jeypore taluks. Stock of food grains sufficient. Prospects normal. Jeypore exporting rice. Common rice selling at 13 seers a rupee at Jeypore and at 10 seers in Gunupur and Parlakimedi.

GENERAL SUMMARY:—During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the province. The fall was heavy in Koraput and in parts of Puri and Ganjam districts and light to moderate elsewhere. Rivers and streams are in flood in the Koraput district. Weeding of *bialai* paddy is going on in Cuttack and Puri districts. Transplantation of saradh paddy continues. Condition of *bhadai* crops, *til*, and cotton is fair. Sugarcane is not thriving in the Balasore district owing to excessive rain. Sowing of the jute crop is finished in the Cuttack district and its condition is reported to be healthy and fair in Cuttack and Balasore districts. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 12.36 seers a rupee. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Cuttack, Balasore, Puri, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.
