1	CUTTACK ..	Inches. 2.68	15 $\frac{3}{4}$	14 $\frac{7}{16}$	Rainfall at Jajpur 1.59, at Kendrapara 1.73 and at Angul 6.73 inches. Weather seasonable. Its effect on agricultural operations not beneficial and on crops not favourable. Flood came and subsided. Sowings of <i>biali</i> , <i>saradh</i> and jute in progress. Sugarcane thriving and vegetables doing well. Cattle-disease is reported from Patkura and Jagatsingpur police-stations. Fodder and water sufficient. Common rice selling at 13 $\frac{1}{8}$ seers a rupee at Jajpur and 15 $\frac{3}{4}$ seers at Kendrapara and Angul.
2	BALASORE ..	0.56	12	12	Rainfall at Bhadrak 0.67 inch. Weather seasonable. Sowing of paddy on broadcast is going on. Sugarcane and vegetables thriving well. No cattle-disease is reported. Fodder and water sufficient. Common rice selling at 13 seers a rupee at Bhadrak.

Fodder and water sufficient. No cattle-disease is reported. Common rice selling at 15 $\frac{1}{16}$ seers a rupee at Khurda.

4	SAMBALPUR ..	Inches. 0·89	13	13	Rainfall at Bargarh 9·85 and at Nawapara 13·25 inches. Weather seasonable. Sowing of paddy continues. Cattle-disease is reported from Barpali, Bheran and Nawapara thanas. Common rice selling at 13½ seers a rupee at Bargarh and 13 seers at Nawapara.

(Prices in rupees and decimals of a rupee to two places per imperial maund of 3,200 tolas.) Common rice selling at 12 seers a rupee at Khondmals. Water-supply sufficient for drinking and agricultural operations in all taluks. Ploughing of land in progress in Khondmals. Sowing of paddy in Baliguda, Ghumsur, Aska, Chatrapur and Berhampur taluk; of <i>ragi</i> in Baliguda and Ghumsur taluks, of <i>kuhuri</i> in Baliguda taluk; of gingelly in Gumsur taluk; and of Samai and light paddy in G. Udaigiri taluk is in progress. Transplantation of paddy commenced in G. Udaigiri. Plantation of sugarcane in progress in Ghumsur and Aska taluks. Sugarcane is progressing favourably in Khondmals. Gingelly and <i>sua</i> in Surada taluk and Samai and paddy in G. Udaigiri fair; extents appreciable; condition fair; <i>ragi</i> in Berhampur taluk, extent inappreciable, condition fair. Pasture available; fodder sufficient; condition of men and cattle generally good. Labour available. Stock of food grains sufficient. Prospects fair. Reservoir at Russellkonda 32·90 feet and at Surada 23·60 feet.

6	KORAPUT ..	Inches. 1.52	Rainfall at Nowrangpur 5.90 and at Rayaghada 2.31 inches. Weather rainy. Paddy sowing proceeding in Rayaghada, Nowrangpur, Bissemkatak, Gunupur, Parlakimedi, Malkanagiri and Pottanghi taluks; <i>vagi</i> in Rayaghada, Parlakimedi and Pottanghi taluks; <i>sama</i> in Rayaghada, Malkanagiri and Pottanghi taluks and gingelly in Gunupur taluk. Transplantation of paddy proceeding in Jeypore and Pattanghi taluks, sugarcane in Gunupur taluk. Broadcast paddy thriving and Jeypore paddy in Koraput taluk. Sugarcane thriving in Gunupur, Parlakimedi, Rayaghada, Bissemkatak, Jeypur, Nowrangpur and Koraput taluks. Water and fodder sufficient. Cattle-disease in parts of Parlakimedi taluk. Public health, wages and prospects normal. Labour available. Stock of food-grains sufficient. Common rice selling at 14 seers a rupee at Jeypore and 10 seers in Gunupur and Parlakimedi.

GENERAL SUMMARY :—During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the Province. The fall was heavy in parts of Cuttack, Puri, Sambalpur, Ganjam and Koraput and light to moderate elsewhere. Floods subsided in Cuttack district. Sowing of *biali* and *saradh* paddy is in progress but it is retarded to a great extent in Puri owing to heavy rains. Transplantation of paddy has commenced in Ganjam and Koraput districts. *Dalua* paddy is being harvested and threshed in Puri. Sowing of *average* price of local common rice at headquarters markets was 14.12 seers a rupee. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. Cattle-disease is reported from parts of Cuttack, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.
