GENERAL SUMMARY :--During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the province. The fall was moderate in Balasore, in parts of Puri, Ganjam, Koraput and light elsewhere. Condition of dalua paddy is fair in Berhampur taluk and its harvesting continues at places in Puri. Sugarcane is thriving. Ploughing and manuring of paddy fields continue. Sowing of jute has commenced in Cuttack. Sowing of paddy fields has commenced in Cuttack, Balasore, Puri and Koraput districts. The average price of local common rice at the headquarters markets was 14.58 seers a rupee. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient except in some parts of Angul subdivision and Koraput district. Fodder is reported to be insufficient in parts of Ganjam and Koraput. Cattle-disease is reported from three districts.
