5	Ganjam	Inches.			Water-supply insufficient for drinking in parts of Kodala and Surada taluks. Sufficient for drinking only in Ghumsar, G. Udayagari taluks. Sufficient for drinking and agriculture in Aska, Chatrapur, Berhampur and Baliguda taluks, and Khondmals subdivision. Pasture available. Fodder sufficient. Condition of men and cattle- generally good. Labour available. Stock of food-grains sufficient. Prospects generally fair. Reservoir at Russulkunda 29.35 feet and at Surada 16.40 feet. Agency paddy first sort 1.57, second sort 1.49, boiled rice 2.99, raw rice 4.73, ragi 1.31. Horse gram 2.69, salt 3.48. Littoral paddy first sort 1.98, second sort 1.74, boiled rice 3.03, raw rice 3.91, ragi 2.21, horse gram 2.14, salt 2.45. (Prices are given in rupee and decimals of a rupee to two places for imperial maund of 3,200 tolas.) Rice, cumbu and Karkateh, salt
6	KOBAPUT			13½	selling at 12, 15 and 8 seers a rupee, respectively, in Khondmals.  Water scarcity in parts of Bissem Katak, Parlakimedi taluks. Sugarcane transplantation retarded in Gunupur taluk. Sugarcane not thriving in parts of Rayaghada taluk, thriving in parts of Nowrangapur taluk. Fodder scarcity in parts of Bissem katak taluk. Cattle foot-disease in parts of Nowrangapur taluk, condition generally good elsewhere. Public health, wages, prospects normal. Labour available. Cholera at Ramagiri, Udaigiri. Effective measures being taken. Stock of food-grains sufficient. Large import of rice into Parlakimedi taluk from Puri side. Common rice selling at 13 seers a rupee in Nowrangapur division and 10 seers in Gunupur division.

General Summary:—During the week under report there was no rain in the province. Threshing of winter rice is still in progress in Puri. Harvesting of dalua paddy continues in Cuttack and Puri. Transplantation of sugarcane is retarded in Gunupur taluk. It is thriving in other districts except in Rayaghada taluk of Koraput. Mandua. china and mung are being harvested. Preparation for want of rain. The average price of local common rice at the headquarters markets was 15.87 seers Koraput and Angul subdivision where scarcity of water is reported. Shortage of fodder is reported from parts of Koraput. Cattle-disease is reported from two districts.
