NOTICE

The M. A. Examinations in Oriya and English will commence on 1st August 1944. Applications together with the prescribed fee of Rs. 75 per candidate should reach the Registrar on or before the 15th May 1944. Applications will on no account be received after this date.

2. The fee should be remitted to the Imperial Bank of India, Cuttack, to be credited to the Utkal University General Fund Account. Money orders addressed to the Registrar on this account will not be accepted.

3. Non-collegiate candidates whose names have not been on the rolls of colleges in Orissa, prior to the inception of the Utkal University should pay a registration fee of Rs. 2 before they can be permitted to sit for the examinations.

RULES FOR ADMISSION INTO THE CUTTACK TRAINING COLLEGE

SESSION 1944-45

1. Applications are invited from candidates for admission into the Cuttack Training College for the session 1944-45.

2. The College prepares students for the Diploma-in-Education examination of the Utkal University. A degree of an Indian or any other recognised University is the minimum entrance qualification. Those who have appeared or are going to appear at the B. A. or B. Sc. examination but whose results are not yet out or will be out later may also apply and sit for the qualifying entrance examination. Their admission will depend on the success of their B.A. or B.Sc. examination as well as the results of the entrance examination.

3. Number of admission is limited to 30. All applicants must be natives of or domiciled in the Province. Candidates from the Orissa States who are Oriyas will be admitted on the same basis as Oriya candidates from the Province subject to the existing reservation of two seats for them in the event of less than two candidates qualifying for admission in the competitive examination. They should not, however, be eligible for the bursaries and the books provided by Government at the Training College.

One Oriya student from Singhbhum district will also be admitted into this College but he will not be eligible for bursary and the books provided by the Government as in the case of candidates from States.

Five (5) bursaries each of the value of Rs. 24 a month will be awarded to necessitous students especially to those of the scheduled castes and hill tribes. Candidates must qualify by passing entrance examination which will be a test in general knowledge and intelligence but the bursaries will be awarded definitely on economic grounds.

The system of reservation of bursaries will be as follows:—

- 1 for scheduled castes,
- 1 for hill tribes, and
- 3 open.

Any bursary not awarded to the candidate of the category for which it is reserved will be added to the open class. Women candidates should have a prior claim to the open bursaries. Fifteen sets of text books will be awarded to 15 candidates on payment of a book-fee of Rs. 10 each, which must be returned to the College in good condition at the end of the session.

4. All applicants shall be required to take a qualifying entrance examination which will be held in the College on the 5th May 1944, at 8 A.M. No admission will be made without a personal interview which would take place on the 6th May 1944, at 8 A.M. and on the 7th May 1944 at 8 A.M. if necessary. The age-limit for admission is 31, but preference will be given to younger candidates who are fresh from the colleges. If necessary teachers with shorter period of teaching experience may be taken in. Candidates over 28 years of age are not ordinarily accepted. Each applicant must send Rs. 5 being caution money and annas ten towards charges, etc., or the entrance examination along with his application and obtain from the college office in lieu of the payment of Rs. 5-10-0 his admit card. Without this amount his application will not be accepted and his name will not be enlisted. No candidate will be allowed to sit for the examination unless he has shown his admit card to the presiding officer. In their own interest, candidates are warned to be in possession of admit cards before the date of the examination. Only papers will be supplied to candidates who will sit for the examination. Candidates are allowed to write out their answers with a pencil or with their fountain pen. The caution money will be forfeited if a candidate fails to join after admission or withdraws at any time during the session. The money will be refunded in case admission is not granted and in case of those who are admitted, at the end of session. A candidate, claiming domicile in Orissa, must submit copy of his certificate of domicile along with his application and on admission the original degree certificates must be produced by all candidates for inspection of the Principal on the date of admission.

5. If a candidate does not join within a week of his being informed that he has been accepted, his admission will be cancelled and his caution money forfeited.

6. Each selected candidate who obtains a bursary will be required to enter into an agreement in the prescribed form, binding him to complete the course of training to the satisfaction of the Principal and hereafter to serve if required to do so either as a teacher in a Government School or in an institution aided by the Government or as an Inspecting Officer in the Education Department for a period of five years from the date of completion of trainings. If he withdraws before completing the course, he will have to refund the bursary drawn by him. No permission will be given to candidates admitted for private tuition and study of Law during the course of training.

7. Such candidates as do not belong to the Utkal University and graduated from any other University must also pay at the time of admission the registration and migration fees* levied by and payable to both the Universities.

8. All College charges must be paid at the time of admission, viz., the game fee, the common-room fee and examination fee which are Rs. 3, Rs. 2 and Rs. 1-7-0 respectively for the session.

9. No fees are charged for tuition and free hostel accommodation is provided for all the students.

10. Attempts will be made to accommodate lady students in the Ravenshaw Girls' School hostel during the session for which previous notice should be given.

11. In applying for admission, candidates should supply the following particulars in their own handwriting :—

RULES FOR ADMISSION INTO THE COMMERCIAL CLASS ATTACHED TO THE CUTTACK TRAINING SCHOOL FOR THE SESSION, 1944-45.

1. The next session of the Commercial Class attached to the Cuttack Training School begins from the 3rd July 1944 and extends over a period of one year. Admissions will ordinarily be closed on 31st July 1944, provided the seats are not filled up till then. The maximum number of seats available is 48.

2. Subjects taught are—(1) Shorthand, (2) Typewriting and Drafting and (3) Book-keeping. Subject or subjects taken up at the time of admission can neither be changed nor given up later on any circumstances.

3. The classes are held both in the morning and in the evening.

4. The minimum qualification for admission is the possession of a Matriculation Certificate or a School Leaving Certificate eligible for the College Course. Preference will, however, be given to those who possess better and higher educational qualifications.

5. Fees are charged at the following rates :—

No admission fee is charged

6. An examination fee of Re. 1 per subject is charged from the candidates appearing at the Annual Examination.

7. Ex-students of the class, either plucked or unable to appear at the examination after completing the course, will be allowed to appear twice as private candidates on payment of the prescribed fee.

8. Applications for admission should be sent to the Headmaster, Cuttack Training School, on or before the 29th June 1944 in the form given below which can be had by the candidate from the Headmaster either in person or by sending nine pies worth of postage stamps.

NOTICE

The next Matriculation Examination will commence on Monday, 19th June 1944. Applications together with the fee of Rs. 15 should reach the Registrar on or before 15th May 1944. Applications will in no case be received after this date.

2. All examination fees should be remitted to the Imperial Bank of India, Cuttack, to be credited to the Utkal University General Fund Account. Money orders addressed to the Registrar will not be accepted on this account.

3. Candidates who remitted the full fee for the Matriculation Examination of February 1944, and were not able to sit for the examination may sit for the ensuing examination on payment of half the prescribed fee.

4. In view of the short duration of the school session preceding the June Examination, the provisions of Regulation 4 (b) (v) of Chapter I of the University Regulations regarding attendance at ten lectures in Hygiene may be relaxed for candidates appearing at the Matriculation Examination of June 1944. Applications may be forwarded by Headmasters and other authorised persons, even though the candidates may not have attended the prescribed number of lectures in Hygiene.

5. For the Matriculation Examination of June 1944, the Regulations provide that candidates who have not attended any school for six months previous to the date of the said examination may be permitted to sit for the examination as private candidates if they satisfy other conditions laid down in the Regulations. For the purposes of this provision, the term "six months" means the period between the end of the school year in 1943, and the date of commencement of the Matriculation Examination of June 1944.

RULES FOR ADMISSION INTO THE CUTTACK TRAINING SCHOOL

SESSION 1944-45

Ten bursars from British Orissa and thirty non-stipendiary candidates including Oriyas from the Orissa States will be admitted to the first year class of the Cuttack Training School on the 3rd July 1944.

2. Only those should apply (a) who are of good physique, of active habits and free from constitutional defects, (b) who are prepared to take active interest in drill, games, gardening, scouting and other extra curricular activities and (c) who are proficient in Oriya literature. All candidates must be natives of or domiciled in the Province of Orissa.

3. Candidates holding Matriculation or School Leaving Examination Certificates, declared eligible to the College Course, should submit with their applications Certified copies of the marks secured by them at the examinations. I.A's and I.Sc's will have to submit the University certificates in original at the time of admission.

4. Only such candidates who have just passed their Matriculation or Intermediate examinations will be admitted. Preference will be given to those possessing higher qualifications specially to candidates with Intermediate qualifications, provided they satisfy all other conditions.

5. Intending candidates are required to appear at the test examination for admission which will be held in the Training School on the 3rd July 1944 at 12 noon. They should come provided with writing materials. The examination will be of the nature of an intelligence test and a test in Oriya language.

6. Bursaris will be awarded to poor candidates of merit. Intending bursars will have to produce along with their applications certificates of poverty from gentlemen of rank and from the heads of the institutions in which they read last. The bursaries will be distributed as follows :—

Two for scheduled castes ; two for hill tribes ; six open.

Preference will be given to women candidates, who do not require special arrangements. Bursaries not awarded to scheduled castes and hill tribes will be open to all.

7. All male students will have to reside in the hostel and deposit an amount of Rs. 2 as caution money. Besides they will have to pay an approximate sum of Rs. 3-8-0 each year as game fees and medicine fees.

8. Before admission into the school the selected candidate will be required (i) to produce his transfer certificate from the institution in which the candidate read last and a certificate of character, (ii) to execute an agreement binding him to complete the prescribed course, to abide by the school and hostel rules and on completion of the course, extending over two years, to serve as a teacher in the Province of Orissa for at least five years in case of bursars and three years in case of non-bursars if required to do so, and if offered a post on an initial salary not less than that from time to time prescribed by Government as the minimum pay for teachers of his qualifications in the class of school concerned. Those who give up their studies before the expiry of their period of training will be liable to refund all the money received by them as bursary.

9. Trained Matrics or S. L. C.'s are allowed to appear at the I.A. examination of the Utkal University after serving for one year as teachers in a recognised school of the Province.

10. Applications for admission must reach the Headmaster, Cuttack Training School, on or before the 15th June 1944 in the form given below containing full particulars.

11. Printed forms can be obtained from this office either personally or on application with postage stamps worth nine pies only. Applications should be addressed to the Headmaster, Cuttack Training School, and not by name.
