RULES FOR ADMISSION INTO THE CUTTACK TRAINING SCHOOL  
SESSION 1944-45

Ten bursars from British Orissa and thirty non-stipendiary candidates including Oriyas from the Orissa States will be admitted to the first year class of the Cuttack Training School on the 3rd July 1944.

2. Only those should apply (a) who are of good physique, of active habits and free from constitutional defects, (b) who are prepared to take active interest in drill, games, gardening, scouting and other extra curricular activities and (c) who are proficient in Oriya literature. All candidates must be natives of or domiciled in the Province of Orissa.

3. Candidates holding Matriculation or School Leaving Examination Certificates, declared eligible to the College Course, should submit with their applications Certified copies of the marks secured by them at the examinations. I.A.'s and I.Sc.'s will have to submit the University certificates in original at the time of admission.

4. Only such candidates who have just passed their Matriculation or Intermediate examinations will be admitted. Preference will be given to those possessing higher qualifications specially to candidates with Intermediate qualifications, provided they satisfy all other conditions.

5. Intending candidates are required to appear at the test examination for admission which will be held in the Training School on the 3rd July 1944 at 12 noon. They should come provided with writing materials. The examination will be of the nature of an intelligence test and a test in Oriya language.

6. Bursaris will be awarded to poor candidates of merit. Intending bursars will have to produce along with their applications certificates of poverty from gentlemen of rank and from the heads of the institutions in which they read last. The bursaries will be distributed as follows:—

Two for scheduled castes; two for hill tribes; six open.

Preference will be given to women candidates, who do not require special arrangements. Bursaries not awarded to scheduled castes and hill tribes will be open to all.

7. All male students will have to reside in the hostel and deposit an amount of Rs. 2 as caution money. Besides they will have to pay an approximate sum of Rs. 3-8-0 each year as game fees and medicine fees.

8. Before admission into the school the selected candidate will be required (i) to produce his transfer certificate from the institution in which the candidate read last and a certificate of character, (ii) to execute an agreement binding him to complete the prescribed course, to abide by the school and hostel rules and on completion of the course, extending over two years, to serve as a teacher in the Province of Orissa for at least five years in case of bursars and three years in case of non-bursars if required to do so, and if offered a post on an initial salary not less than that from time to time prescribed by Government as the minimum pay for teachers of his qualifications in the class of school concerned. Those who give up their studies before the expiry of their period of training will be liable to refund all the money received by them as bursary.

9. Trained Matrics or S. L. C.'s are allowed to appear at the I.A. examination of the Utkal University after serving for one year as teachers in a recognised school of the Province.

10. Applications for admission must reach the Headmaster, Cuttack Training School, on or before the 15th June 1944 in the form given below containing full particulars.

11. Printed forms can be obtained from this office either personally or on application with postage stamps worth nine pies only. Applications should be addressed to the Headmaster, Cuttack Training School, and not by name.

### COMMITTEE OF LEGAL EDUCATION, BIHAR AND ORISSA, HIGH COURT, PATNA, 1944

The next Mukhtarship Examination will be held on the 14th August, 1944 at the following hours and in the respective subjects noted herein :—

10-30 A.M. to 1 P.M.—Land Laws, the law of Civil procedure, the Law of Limitation, Law of Contract, Hindu and Muhammadan Law and the Interpretation of Statutes.

2 P.M. to 4-30 P.M.—Law of Crimes and Procedure and the law of Evidence.

There will be ten questions to be answered in each paper. Each paper will carry 150 marks. In order to pass in the subject the candidate must secure 75 marks out of 150 i.e., 50 per cent. But unless the candidate secures 66⅔ per cent of the total Marks he shall not pass, i.e., out of 300 he must secure 200 when he shall be declared as passed.

The examination of those candidates who have submitted their applications for leave to appear at the examination through the District Judge of Cuttack, Ganjam-Puri (Berhampore) and Koraput will be held at the Ravenshaw Collegiate school, Cuttack. ### RULES FOR ADMISSION INTO THE COMMERCIAL CLASS ATTACHED TO THE CUTTACK TRAINING SCHOOL FOR THE SESSION, 1944-45.

1. The next session of the Commercial Class attached to the Cuttack Training School begins from the 3rd July 1944 and extends over a period of one year. ## RAVENSHAW COLLEGE, CUTTACK

SESSION 1944-45

The College will reopen on 3rd July 1944. Lectures for the Second and Fourth Year classes will begin on the 4th, for the First and Third Year on the 17th.

2. Students (other than those promoted to the second, fourth or sixth Year classes) who desire admission or re-admission to any class in the College must send a written application in the prescribed form by the 10th June 1944. Forms of application can be obtained from the College office either personally or by sending a stamped and addressed envelope. Applicants for these forms must state (a) their age, (b) whether they intend to reside in a College hostel or with their parents or recognised guardians. All correspondence must be addressed to the Principal and not to any one by name.

3. Admissions to all classes including Law will begin on the 26th June and students are advised to get themselves admitted before the 3rd of July, as otherwise they run the risk of being refused admission for want of accommodation.

4. Along with the application form, the College office will supply a residential form, and a form of undertaking to be signed by the applicant and his guardian. Different forms of undertaking will be supplied according as the applicant is below or above eighteen years of age. No application will be considered which is not accompanied by properly filled and signed residence and undertaking forms.

5. In addition to the forms noted above, a matriculate must also submit (a) a leaving certificate in the prescribed form signed by the Headmaster of the school in which he last studied; and (b) a health card issued by the school and signed by the Headmaster and the School Medical Officer.

6. Preference is given to applicants who are Oriyas or domiciled in Orissa and who have passed their last University examination in the first or second division. No one, however, applying after the opening of the College can claim special consideration.

7. Ex-students of the College who have failed at the last University examination may be readmitted, but cannot claim readmission as a right. Those who have already spent three years in the Intermediate classes will not ordinarily be readmitted: and even for those failed Intermediate students who have spent only two years in the College, the accommodation is very limited.

8. All failed students seeking admission must produce the University Registrar's receipt showing that they were admitted to the examination for which they wish to sit.

9. Students of the College must reside either with their parents, or with local guardians approved by the Principal, or in the College hostels. Students are strongly advised to make arrangements for their residence at least a week before the session begins. Those who wish to live in the College hostels should apply to the Principal.

10. There is a furnished hostel for girl students, where six students may live on payment of a monthly rent of Rs. 2 each. They must make their own arrangement for food.

11. The hostels will reopen on 26th June. A copy of the hostel rules may be had from the College office.

12. Students of the senior classes, and those who have already lived in a hostel for two years or more, can be admitted only after accommodation has been provided for the Intermediate students who have not completed two years' stay in a hostel.

13. The College is affiliated to the Utkal University in Arts, Science and Law, and candidates are prepared for the following examinations:—

I.A., I.Sc., B.A. (Pass and Honours), B.Sc. (Pass and Honours), M.A. and B.L.

14. In addition to English and Vernacular (Oriya and Urdu), instruction is provided for the Intermediate and B.A. students in the following subjects and groups of subjects. But no class in any particular group will be formed unless there is a reasonable number of students choosing that group.

## INTERMEDIATE EXAMINATION IN ARTS

E., Ed., G., H., L., M., O. or S. Ps.

An Intermediate student has to choose three optional subjects, and may choose any three of the above, provided that Mathematics should not be taken with Economics or History, nor Geography with Psychology. Those who pass their I. A. examination with Education as one of their optional subjects are likely to be preferred for appointment as teachers.

15. Once a student has chosen his group of subjects, he will not ordinarily be permitted to change it. To enable him to choose the combination best suited to him, the Heads of Departments will arrange a series of 'Orientation Lectures' during the first two weeks of the session. Students seeking admission to the College are advised to attend these lectures.

16. The College prepares students for the B.A. and B.Sc. Honours examinations in the following subjects:—

English, Sanskrit, Persian, Oriya, Philosophy, History, Economics, Physics, Chemistry, Botany and both B.A. and B.Sc. Mathematics.

Those who take up Botany and Oriya for their B.A. will not be allowed to do Honours in any subject.

17. For the M.A. examination the College is affiliated only in English (Group A).

18. Accommodation in the following classes and subjects is limited:—

I Year Science—160 (of whom no more than 80 can do Biology).

Education—32

Geography—32

Logic—144

Psychology—144

Economics—160

## III Year Science (Pass and Honours):

64 (of whom no more than 16 can do Chemistry Honours).

## III Year Arts (Economics)—64 (including 16 Honours).

*Applicants desirous of doing these subjects are therefore advised to get themselves admitted as soon as possible. They must also state in their application form whether, in the event of their not being able to get seats in the particular subjects for which they apply, they are prepared to take alternative subjects and, if so, what alternative subjects they would like to take. Failure to state this may result in their not being admitted to the College at all.*

19. Students who have passed their Matriculation examination in the second or third division and wish to do Science, as well as those who have passed their Intermediate examination in the third division and wish to take up Honours in any subject must submit, along with their application for admission, an authorised statement of the marks obtained by them in their last University examination.

20. Those who have passed their Matriculation examination in the first or second division and wish to do Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry, may, at their option, take Biology as an additional subject, provided they satisfy the Professor of Biology as to their fitness for doing that subject.

21. The University Regulations do not permit a student to read Physics (Pass or Honours) or Chemistry (Honours) for the B.Sc. examination unless he has taken Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry for the Intermediate examination.

Students who have passed the I.Sc. examination can proceed to the B.A. examination only after passing the I.A. examination in one of the Arts subjects mentioned below at the end of their third year:—

Sanskrit, Arabic, Persian, Hindi, Oriya, Bengali or Urdu; History; Logic; Psychology; Economics; Education.

23. Students taking Biology or Botany have to buy their own dissecting instruments, namely, (1) a razor, (2) a pair of scissors, (3) a pair of forceps, (4) a scalpel, (5) two mounted needles, and (6) two camel hair brushes.

24. Attendance at drill classes is compulsory for undergraduate boarders except for those who are physically incapacitated from such attendance. A fine of two annas is levied for each day of absence.

25. Day scholars are placed in charge of tutors who advise them on matters relating to their studies, health, sports and general welfare. They must get into touch

with their respective tutors as soon as they are admitted into the college, and must have their residence forms countersigned by the tutors before they pay their fees for August.

26. A student of the College must abide by such hygienic principles and submit himself to such anti-epidemic procedure as would be laid down by the Principal.

## CIRCULAR No. 15

1. The Supplementary Matriculation examination will commence from Monday, June 19, 1944 and will continue from day to day, holidays excepted. The prescribed application form of each candidate together with a fee of Rs. 25 must reach the Registrar on or before Monday, May 22, 1944.

2. The Supplementary I. A., I. Sc., I. Com. Pre-Medical B. A., B. Sc. and B. Com. examinations will commence from Monday, June 26, 1944 and will continue from day to day holidays excepted. The prescribed fee for each of these examinations are:—Rs. 40 for the I. A., I. Sc., I. Com. examination, Rs. 50 for the B. A., B. Sc. B. Com. (Pass course) examination and Rs. 25 for the Pre-Medical examination. The application of each candidate for any of these examinations together with the prescribed fee must reach the Registrar on or before Monday, May 29, 1944.

3. The fees as well as the application forms must reach the University office on or before the dates mentioned above. Under no circumstances can or will any candidate be admitted to the examination whose fee and form are not received by the Registrar on or before the date fixed.

4. All letters to the Registrar must be addressed as follows: "The Registrar, Patna University, P. O. Bankipore".

5. Information as to the number of application forms required should be supplied to the Registrar immediately after the receipt of this notice.

6. Applications for change of centre of examinations must be made separately through heads of institution with an extra fee of Rs. 3 over and above the ordinary examination fee. They must reach the Registrar not later than June 1, 1944 in case of Matriculation examination and June 8, 1944 in case of other examinations. The arrangement to be made for the identification of an applicant at the new centre must be clearly and definitely stated. If this is not done the application will be rejected. Mere mention in the examination form of a centre other

than the usual centre of examination will not entitle a candidate to change his centre. Private and non-collegiate candidates will not be allowed to change their centres.

7. Private candidates for the I. A., and B. A., examinations shall be required to appear personally before the centre Superintendents, before the commencement of examination (a) to obtain their admit cards, and (b) to be satisfactorily identified.

8. When a candidate claims that he may be permitted to appear at an examination on payment of half the prescribed fee, the claim must be supported by the University letter allowing such concession; if this is not done, full fee shall have to be paid. The letter must be attached to the candidates application form.

9. Examination fees of school and college candidates should be sent by the Headmasters and Principals concerned either by Remittance Transfer Receipts, crossed cheques, bank drafts drawn in favour of the Registrar, Patna University, *for credit in the University Account*. B. Cheques should include discount at the rate of  $\frac{1}{4}\%$  per hundred. Names of examinations, the number of candidates for whom fees are remitted and the name of institution should be clearly noted on the enclosed chalan. Those institutions which deposit University fees through the Imperial Bank of India, Patna, by money orders, should deposit examination fees only, and other fees namely fees for change of centre, and marks should be sent separately, direct to the Registrar, Patna University. Chalan sent herewith should be returned to this office duly filled up to show the amount of fees deposited in the Bank by Head of Institutions. Acknowledgment from the Bank should be forwarded to the Registrar as soon as received. Payment to the university of any kind including the examination fees should on no account be made in Treasury.

10 Private candidates for the Matriculation examination should forward their application forms and fees through the Headmasters of schools at which they appeared at the test examination. Other private candidates may remit their fees by money order to the Registrar, Patna University, P. O. Bankipore in time to reach him on the appointed date together with applications G. C. Notes will not be accepted unless presented personally.

11. It may also be noted that in addition to existing system of issuing marks to examinees a college or school may secure the scheduled marks of all its examinees at a particular examination on payment in advance, of a lump sum equal to one rupee per examinee.

Fees for scheduled marks should be remitted direct to the Registrar after the commencement of the examination after ascertaining the exact number of candidates who have actually appeared at the examination.
