#### RAVENSHAW COLLEGE, CUTTACK.

SESSION 1937-38.

The college will re-open on the 17th July, 1937.

Students (other than those promoted to the 2nd, 4th or 6th year classes) who desire admission or re-admission to any class in the college must send a written application in the prescribed form on or before the 15th June 1937. Every application in the case of matriculates must be accompanied by (1) a leaving certificate signed by the headmaster of the school in which the candidate last studied in form no. 66 of Schedule XIX of the Bihar and Orissa Education Department, and (2) their health cards, issued by the schools they have attended with the signature of the headmaster and the school medical officer on the cards. All failed students seeking admission must produce the University Registrar's receipt showing that they were admitted to the examination.

2. No application will be considered unless accompanied by the prescribed form signed by the guardian or parents with whom the applicant intends to reside in the town or the form of application for admission to a college hostel. Students who do not live in the college hostels or with their parents or near relatives are warned that no mess will ordinarily be recognised by the Principal. Guardians who are not blood relatives of their wards will only be recognised in exceptional cases. Students should also note that the cost of living in the hostels has been considerably reduced. 'B' class messes have been opened in the hostels for poor boys.

3. Forms of application can be obtained from the college office either personally or by sending an addressed envelope bearing postage stamps worth one anna. Applicants for forms must state whether they intend to reside in the college hostel or with parents or recognised guardians.

4. All correspondence should be addressed to the Principal *and not by name.*

## RAVENSHAW COLLEGE, CUTTACK.

### PROSPECTUS.

Forms of application for admission may be obtained from the college office. The following combinations of subjects in addition to English and Vernacular (Oriya, Bengali, Urdu and Hindi in the case of the Intermediate and B.A. classes) are admissible, but no class in any particular group will be formed unless there is a reasonable number of candidates for that group:—

#### Intermediate Examination in Arts.

H.L.S., L.M.S., H.B.L., B.L.S., H.L.O.,  
L.M.O., B.L.O.

#### Intermediate Examination in Science.

C.M.P., B.M.C.

Optional (additional) Botany or German may be taken with the first combination. All students who wish to take up Botany, either for the I.A. or I.Sc. will be examined by the Professor of Botany before they are finally allowed to take this subject.

#### B. A. Examination.

H.S., M.S., Ph.S., H.E., E.S., H.Ph.,  
E.M., B.E.

Honours may be taken in English, History, Philosophy, Sanskrit, Persian, Mathematics or Economics.

#### B. Sc. Examination.

M.P.C., C.M.E.

Honours may be taken in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry or Botany.

[H=History, L=Logic, S=Sanskrit or Persian, M=Mathematics, B=Botany, C=Chemistry, P=Physics, Ph=Philosophy, E=Economics, O=Oriya as a principal subject.]

#### English Group A.

Applicants are reminded that the University Regulations do not permit a student to read Physics (Pass or Honours) and Chemistry (Honours) for the B.Sc. Examination unless he has taken Physics, Mathematics

and Chemistry for the Intermediate Examination, nor Philosophy for the B.A. Examination unless he has taken Logic for the I.A. Examination. Students who have passed the I.Sc. Examination can only proceed in this college to the B.A. Examination by passing the I.A. Examination in one Arts subject at the end of their third year. Exception is made however in the case of students who take the combination E.M. and B.E., provided Mathematics and Botany were taken up at the I.Sc. Examination.

Preference is given to applicants who are resident in Orissa and who have passed the last University Examination in the first or second division. No one, however, applying after the opening of the college can claim special consideration. Ex-students of the college who have failed at the last University Examination may be re-admitted but they have no claim to re-admission. Those who have already spent three years in the Intermediate classes will not ordinarily be admitted. Botany may be taken as a subject in the third year B.Sc. class without previous study at the Intermediate stage.

Applicants for admission desirous of taking up English for the M.A. Examination, Chemistry, Physics or Botany will be specially selected by the Professors of those subjects.

The college fees and subscriptions are as follows:—

Tuition fees—I.A. Rs. 6; I.Sc. Rs. 7;  
B.A. (Pass and Hons.) Rs. 7; B.Sc.  
(Pass and Hons.) Rs. 8; B.L.  
Rs. 10; M.A. Rs. 10.

Admission fee—a fee equal to the tuition fee.

Athletic Club subscription—Rs. 2-0-0 per annum.

Common Room (and magazine subscription)—Re. 1-8-0 per annum.

Examination charges—Re. 1-8-0 per annum.

University Registration fee (for first year students)—Rs. 2-0-0.

Medical fees—Re. 1 must be paid annually by each student of the 1st, 3rd and 5th year classes for medical examination; Re. 1 annually by each day scholar for medical treatment; and Re. 1-2-0 annually by all students, to meet the cost of medicine.

Laboratory deposit—Rs. 5 for each laboratory attended. [This is refunded at the end of the course less the value of breakages or damages done.]

On admission a student pays tuition fees for June and July, subscription to the Athletic Club and Common Room, Examination fee, Registration fee, and Medical fee.

Students may take admission on any day from the 12th to 16th July, but applications for admission should be made as early as possible. The hostels will be open from July 12th. Seats will be allotted by the wardens.

Lectures in accordance with a time-table placed on the college notice board will begin on July 19th and attendances will count as from that date.

Attendance at drill and gymnastic classes is compulsory except for those who are physically incapacitated from such attendance, and games are compulsory for all students. A fine of annas two is levied for the first absence and annas four for each subsequent absence in a month from the drill and gymnastic class.

A student may live (i) in a college hostel, (ii) with his parents, (iii) with a near relative, (iv) with a guardian approved by the Principal. Applicants desirous of living in a college hostel should apply to the Principal for a seat. In the hostel the annual charges, including rent, hire of furniture, lighting, etc., are about Rs. 35. Medical attendance is free. All inmates of the hostel make a deposit of Rs. 10 as caution money—Rs. 5 payable in July and Rs. 5 in September,—which is refunded on their leaving the hostel after paying all dues. A copy of the hostel rules may be had from the college office.

All other applicants for admission to the college should state with whom (mentioning relationship, if any) they propose to live.

Day scholars are placed in charge of tutors who advise them on matters relating to their studies, health and sports, etc.

Students are strongly advised to make arrangements for their residence at least a week before the session begins, as they will not be formally admitted until their residence is approved.

**THE ELLIOTT PRIZE FOR SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH FOR 1937-41.**

In accordance with the Government of Bengal, General Department, revised notification no. 112 T. Edn., dated the 5th May 1917, published in Part I, page 667, of the *Calcutta Gazette*, 1917, the Elliott Prize for Scientific Research for 1937 will be awarded to the author of the best original essays giving the results of original research or investigation made by the candidate in Chemistry and published during the years 1933-36, inclusive.

In accordance with the notification cited above, the Elliott Prize for Scientific Research for 1938 will be awarded to the author of the best original essays giving the results of original research or investigation made by the candidate in Physics and published during the years 1934-37, inclusive.

Any native of Bengal, Bihar or Orissa, or any Anglo-Indian or domiciled European, residing in Bengal, Bihar or Orissa, may compete for the prize.

The essays of competitors must be sent in so as to reach the President of the Royal Asiatic Society of Bengal, C/O the General Secretary, 1 Park Street, Calcutta, by the end of June of this year. Author's reprints must be submitted and not manuscripts. The prize will be awarded to the best competitor and be conferred publicly at the Annual General Meeting of the Royal Asiatic Society of Bengal in February 1938.

Preference will be given to researches leading to discoveries likely to develop the industrial resources of Bengal, Bihar or Orissa.

The value of the prize will not be less than Rs. 210. In the event of no essay being deemed of sufficient merit, no prize will be awarded.

The prizes for the next four years will be allotted as follows:--

1938—Physics.

1939—Geology and Biology (including Pathology and Physiology).

1940—Mathematics.

1941—Chemistry.

All essays submitted must have been published during the four calendar years immediately preceding that for which the prize is given.
