1. The next Law examinations will commence from Monday, January 11, 1937, and will continue from day to day, holidays excepted. The prescribed application form of each candidate together with a fee of Rs. 25 must reach the Registrar on or before Monday, December 14, 1936.

2. The Annual Matriculation examination will commence from Monday, February 15, 1937, and will continue from day to day, holidays excepted. The prescribed application form of each candidate together with a fee of Rs. 15 must reach the Registrar on or before Tuesday, January 5, 1937.

3. The Annual I.A., I.Sc., B.A. and B.Sc. examinations will commence from Monday, February 15, 1937, and will continue from day to day, holidays excepted. The prescribed fees for each of these examinations are:—Rs. 30 for the I. A. or I. Sc. examination, Rs. 40 for the B.A. or B.Sc. (Pass Course) examination and Rs. 50 for the B.A. or B.Sc. (Honours Course) examination. The application of each candidate for any of these examinations together with the prescribed fee must reach the Registrar on or before Monday, January 11, 1937.

4. The application of a candidate, who is sent up for the Annual Matriculation, I.A., I.Sc., B.A. or B.Sc. examination, but for some sufficient cause (certified as such by the head of the institution at which he last studied) is unable to appear thereat, for permission to appear at a subsequent examination, must reach the Registrar accompanied by a registration fee of one rupee on or before the last date fixed for the receipt of fees for each examination.

5. The fees as well as the application forms must reach the University office on or before the dates mentioned above. Under no circumstances can or will any candidate be admitted to the examination whose fee and form are not received by the Registrar on or before the date fixed provided that the Vice-Chancellor may in his discretion direct that a fee shall be accepted which, though received after the specified date, was despatched to the Registrar not less than three days before the specified date.

6. All letters to the Registrar must be addressed in the following way:—"The Registrar, Patna University, P.O. Bankipore."

7. Information as to the number of application forms required should be supplied to the Registrar immediately after the receipt of this notice.

8. Applications for change of centre of examinations must be made separately through heads of institutions. They must reach the Registrar not later than January 20, 1937. The arrangement to be made for the identification of an applicant at the new centre must be clearly and definitely stated. If this is not done the application will be rejected. Mere mention in the examination form of a centre other than the usual centre of examination will not entitle a candidate to change his centre. Private and non-collegiate candidates will not be allowed to change their centres.

9. Private and non-collegiate candidates for the I.A., I.Sc., B.A. and B.Sc. examinations shall be required to appear personally before the centre Superintendents, before the commencement of examination (a) to obtain their admit cards, (b) to pay local levy and (c) to be satisfactorily identified.

10. When a candidate claims that he may be permitted to appear at an examination on payment of half the prescribed fee, the claim must be supported by the University letter allowing such concession; if this is not done, full fee shall have to be paid.

11. Examination and registration fees of school and college candidates should be sent by the headmasters and principals concerned either by remittance transfer receipts, crossed cheques, bank drafts drawn in favour of the Registrar, Patna University, or by money order to the Imperial Bank, Patna or Cuttack, for credit in the University

Account B. Cheques should include discount at the rate of Re. 0-4-0 per hundred. Names of examinations, the number of candidate for whom fees are remitted and the name of institution should be clearly noted on the M. O. coupon. Acknowledgment from the Bank should be forwarded to the Registrar as soon as received.

12. Private candidates for the Matriculation examination should forward their application forms and fees through the headmasters of schools at which they appeared at the test examination. Other private candidates may remit their fees by money order to the Registrar, Patna University, P. O. Bankipore, in time to reach him on the appointed date together with applications. Government Currency notes will not be accepted unless presented personally.

13. It may also be noted that in addition to the existing system of issuing marks to examinees, a college or school may secure the scheduled marks of all its examinees at a particular examination on payment, in advance, of a lump sum equal to one rupee per examinee.

14. A sum of Rs. 500 has been allotted in the budget for paying examination fee of such poor school and college candidates who belong to the depressed classes and aboriginal tribes. The concession shall be granted to only deserving candidates on recommendation of the headmasters and principals. Applications claiming the concession must be submitted through the heads of institutions on or before the 23rd December 1936. No payment of fee from this fund will be made for any student who has already failed at the examination for which he wishes to appear.
