PROSPECTUS OF THE BALASORE COLLEGE

1. The college will open on the 3rd July 1944. Students will be admitted to the 1st year and 2nd year classes in the Arts subjects mentioned below :—

(1) English, (2) Oriya Composition, (3) Sanskrit, (4) Oriya Principal, (5) History, (6) Logic, and (7) Elementary Economics and Public administration.

2. Combinations of subjects for I. A. students :—

English and Oriya Composition are compulsory for all students. Every student has to choose any three of the remaining five subjects, subject to the condition that a student who takes Sanskrit cannot take Oriya Principal and vice versa.

3. Forms of application can be obtained from the office of the Headmaster of the Balasore Zila School, either

personally or by sending a properly stamped and addressed envelope.

4. Applicants for these forms must state (a) their age and (b) their intention as to whether they propose to reside in the college hostel or with their parents or with recognised guardians. Applications must be addressed to the Principal, Balasore College and must reach his office by the 1st of July 1944.

5. Along with the application form, the college office will supply a residence form and a form of undertaking both to be signed by the applicant and his guardian.

Different forms of undertaking will be supplied according as the applicant is below or above 18 years of age. No application will be considered which is not accompanied by properly filled and signed residence and undertaking forms.

6. In addition to the forms noted above, a matriculate must also submit (a) a school leaving certificate, in the prescribed form signed by the Headmaster of the school in which he last studied, (b) a health card issued by the school and signed by both the Headmaster and the School Medical Officer.

7. Preference will be given to candidates who are Oriyas or who are domiciled in Orissa and to those who have passed their last University examination either in the 1st or in the 2nd division. No one, however, who applies after the college opens can claim any special consideration.

8. All failed students seeking admission must produce the University Registrar's receipt showing that they were admitted to the examination for which they last studied.

9. Students of the college must reside either with their parents or with local guardians approved by the Principal or in the college hostel. Students are strongly advised to make arrangements for their residence at least a week before the session begins. Those who wish to live in the college hostel should apply to the Principal in the prescribed form.

10. At the time of admission, a student has to pay the following amounts :—

PROSPECTUS OF THE SAMBALPUR COLLEGE

1. The college will open on the 3rd July 1944. Students will be admitted to the 1st year and 2nd year classes in Arts and Science subjects and only to the 1st year class in Commerce.

2. The college is affiliated to the Utkal University in the following subjects :—

I. A. and I. Sc.—

(A) Compulsory subjects—

(1) English and (2) Oriya Composition.

(B) I. A. Optional—

(1) Sanskrit, (2) Oriya Principal, (3) Elementary Economics and Public Administration, (4) History, (5) Mathematics and (6) Logic.

(C) I. Sc. Optional—

(1) Physics—P, (2) Chemistry—C, (3) Biology—B and (4) Mathematics—M.

(D) I. Com. Compulsory—

(1) Modern English, (2) Oriya Composition, (3) Elementary Economics, (4) Commercial Geography, (5) Elementary Book-keeping and Accounting, (6) Commercial Arithmetic, (7) Business methods and office organisation and (8) Commercial Correspondence and Salesmanship.

(E) I. Com. Optional—

(1) Shorthand and typewriting, (2) Insurance and (3) Banking.

3. (a) Optional subjects for I. A. students—

An Intermediate student in Arts has to choose any three of the six optional subjects given above, subject to the condition that a student who chooses Sanskrit cannot take Oriya principal and vice versa.

(b) Combinations of optional subjects for I. Sc. students :—

M. P. C., Bg. P. C. •

Biology for the first combination and Mathematics for the second combination may be taken as additional subjects.

(c) A student who takes Commerce has to take all compulsory subjects and two of the optional subjects mentioned under Commerce.

4. Forms of application can be obtained from the office of the Headmaster, Sambalpur Zila school either personally or by sending a properly stamped and addressed envelope.

5. Applicants for these forms must state (a) their age and (b) whether they intend to reside in the college hostel or with their parents or recognised guardians. Applications must be addressed to the Principal, Sambalpur College and must reach his office by the 1st of July 1944.

6. Along with application form, the college office will supply (a) a residence form and (b) a form of undertaking both to be signed by the applicant and his guardian.

Different forms of undertaking will be supplied according as the applicant is below or above 18 years of age. No application will be considered which is not accompanied by properly filled and signed residence and undertaking forms.

7. In addition to the forms noted above, a matriculate must also submit (a) a leaving certificate in the prescribed form signed by the headmaster of the school in which he last studied and (b) a health card issued by the school and signed by the headmaster and the school medical officer. (c) Students who have passed the matriculation examination in the third division and wish to take up I.Sc. must submit along with their applications for admission an authorised statement of marks obtained by them in their last university examination. (d) All failed students seeking admission must produce the registrar's receipt showing that they were admitted to the examination for which they last studied.

8. Preference will be given to the applicants who are Oriyas or domiciled in Orissa and who have passed their last university examination either in the first or in the second division. No one, however, who applies after the opening of the college can claim special consideration.

9. Students of the college must reside either with their parents or with local guardians approved by the Principal or in the college hostel. Students are strongly advised to make arrangements for their residence at least a week before the session begins. Those who wish to live in the college hostel should apply to the Principal in the prescribed form.

10. The university regulations do not permit a student to read Physics (Pass or Honours) or Chemistry (Honours) for the B. Sc. examination unless he has taken Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry at the Intermediate stage.

Students who pass the I. Sc. examination may proceed to the B. A. examination if they pass the I. A. examination in one of the Arts subjects prescribed by the university.

11. At the time of admission, a student has to pay the following amounts :—

(1) Rs. 6 or Rs. 7 as admission fee for I. A. and I. Sc. students respectively.

(2) Rs. 12 or Rs. 14 as tuition fee for June and July.

(3) Rs. 2 as athletic club subscription.

(4) Rs. 1-14-0 as college common room and magazine subscription.

(5) Rs. 2 as examination fee.

(6) Rs. 2 as university registration fee.

(7) Rs. 1-8-0 as Day Scholars' Association subscription (payable only by Day scholars).

(8) Re. 1 as fee for medical examination.

(9) Rs. 5 for each as Laboratory caution money for each Laboratory to be attended by the student.

(10) Rs. 5 as Library fee.

NOTE—Item Nos. (9) and (10) are refundable subject to the deductions due to loss or damage by the student.

12. A student who wants admission to the college hostel should pay, in addition, the following amounts :—

(1) Rs. 2-8-0 as establishment charge for June and July,

(2) Rs. 2 as seat rent for June and July,

(3) Re. 1 as Puja subscription,

(4) Re. 0-12-0 as hostel common room subscription for June and July,

(5) Rs. 10 as hostel caution money, and

(6) Rs. 20 as security for good behaviour in the hostel as well as in the college.

NOTE—Item Nos. (5) and (6) are refundable subject to the necessary deductions, if any.

13. The hostel attached to the college will open on the 1st of July 1944. Accommodation is available for 45 students. Boarders should provide themselves with their own lamps, beddings and utensils. A chair, a bedstead, a reading table and a rack will be supplied to each boarder for use in the hostel. A student who is admitted to the hostel must abide by the hostel rules that will be issued by the Principal from time to time.

14. Students taking Biology have to buy their own dissecting instruments, viz., (1) a razor, (2) a pair of scissors, (3) a pair of forceps, (4) a scapel, (5) two mounted needles and (6) two camel hair brushes.

NOTICE

Applications are invited from Oriyas or those domiciled in Orissa or in Orissa States for a research scholarship of Rs. 50 a month.

2. The election will be made in the first instance, for one year only, but a scholarship may be renewed from year to year up to a limit of two years, if the Director is satisfied that the candidate has throughout the year vigorously prosecuted original research in the subject selected by him.

3. Each candidate for the scholarship must submit his application through the head of the institution in which he has read last to the Director and must produce evidence of having passed the Master's Examination or of having obtained some other equivalent or higher degree not more than three years before his application. He must state as definitely as possible, the subject or the section of a subject in which he intends, if elected to a scholarship, to carry on original investigation. He must also indicate the institution in which he proposes to work or if no institution is mentioned, the circumstances or conditions under which he proposes to work.

4. The research scholarship may be held in any institution approved by the Director or original work may be carried on by the research scholar under any other conditions with the previous approval of the Director.

5. At the end of each year's work, the research scholar must submit to the Director a full report on the original work which he has done during the year.

6. The Director reserves to himself the right of deciding whether any of the results of the original researches made by the scholar shall be published and of determining the manner in which such publication shall be made.

7. The Director further reserves to himself the right of declaring without previous notice, that the scholar has forfeited his scholarship at any time during its tenure. Failure to carry out any prescribed condition or to work to the satisfaction of the Director will be considered sufficient reason for forfeiture.
