SCHOOL EXAMINATION BOARD, ORISSA.

NOTICE.

Candidates who desire permission to appear as private candidates at the examination of Elementary Training Schools of North Orissa for 1940 on Middle Vernacular basis on the new syllabus should submit their applications on or before the 10th August 1940 to the headmasters of the Elementary Training Schools where they were originally trained. *They will have to appear at both the theoretical and practical portions of the examination. No exemption will be allowed from the practical or the theoretical test.* Applications should be in English and in the accompanying form. Candidates who have completed 18 months' teaching in a recognised school after appearing at a previous examination must submit with their applications a certificate to that effect from the sub inspector or deputy inspector of schools in whose jurisdiction the school is situated. Such a certificate is not necessary in the case of candidates who failed at the examination but passed the practical test. The headmaster of the Elementary Training School concerned will check the entries in the applications and forward them to the deputy or district inspector of schools on or before the 16th August 1940.

2. The deputy or district inspector of schools will please see carefully that all the particulars are correctly given and forward the applications to the undersigned on or before the 25th August 1940 with his remarks as to the eligibility of each candidate.

3. A fee of Rs. 2-8-0 will be charged from each candidate who is considered eligible by the deputy or district inspector of schools. The chalan showing the deposit of the fee in the treasury should be sent with the application. No application will be considered unless it is accompanied with the chalan.

INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES APPEARING FOR THE EXAMINATIONS TO BE HELD IN SEPTEMBER 1940 AND JANUARY 1941.

Candidates for University Examinations are required to observe the following instructions very carefully:—

1. Silence should be maintained in the examination room.
2. Candidates should take their places in the examination hall at least five minutes before the time fixed for distributing the papers. Candidates presenting themselves more than half an hour after the appointed time will not be admitted to the examination hall. Candidates who are undoubtedly suffering from infectious diseases of any kind will not be admitted.

Candidates should bring with them to the examination hall each day of the examination their hall tickets for inspection by the Chief Superintendent.

3. Candidates are prohibited from writing upon their hall tickets or question papers. Candidates are also prohibited from writing their names on any part of their answer books but their register numbers should be written very distinctly on the outer cover of each answer book. Failure to write their register numbers may involve the rejection of answer papers. They should also fill in the subject and the year on the outer cover of the answer book.

4. Candidates are not allowed to exceed the time assigned to a paper.

5. No candidate will be allowed to leave the examination room till the expiry of at least half an hour after a question paper has been given out; and no candidate who leaves the room during the period allotted for a paper will be allowed to return within that period.

6. *Candidates are forbidden to ask questions of any kind during the examination. They are further forbidden to communicate with the examiners; should they do so their answers will not be valued and their conduct will be reported to the Syndicate for disciplinary action.*

7. Candidates are not allowed the use of books of any kind (except as provided in rule 8). They are also prohibited from introducing into the examination room any book or portion of a book, slate, blotting pad, cardboard, manuscript, or paper of any description and from making use of any of those whether introduced into the room by themselves or by any one else; from communicating with or copying from each other; and from communicating with any person outside the examination room. Any candidate detected in the violation of these rules will be summarily sent out of the room forthwith, and his conduct will be reported to the Registrar. Such a candidate stands the risk of having all his answer papers for the examination for which he has appeared rejected by the Syndicate and of being debarred from sitting for the University examinations for such period as the Syndicate may decide.

The use of stencils at University examinations is not permitted except for students answering papers in Mathematics. The use of mathematical instruments whilst answering papers in mathematics and in the Physical Sciences will be allowed. Such instruments will not be supplied by the University.

8. Clarke's Mathematical and Physical Tables will be supplied to candidates in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Chemical Technology and Geography of the Intermediate, B.A., B.Sc., B.A. (Honours), B.Sc. (Honours), M.Sc. and Pre-Registration (Medicine) examinations and to the candidates answering the Arithmetic and Algebra paper of the Matriculation examination. *Candidates should not bring into the examination hall their own copies.*

9. Candidates for examination in Science subjects shall submit their laboratory note-books to the examiners concerned on the first day of the practical examination. Each of the candidates taking Botany as the main subject for B.Sc. Degree Examination must submit at the practical examination his laboratory note-book, a collection of the named plants collected and preserved by himself and a record of the field work. *The candidates should get back the laboratory note-books at the close of the examination.*

10. Candidates are required to provide themselves with their own pens. Candidates may bring into the examination hall their own ink bottles. They must, however, use only black ink while answering their question papers.

11. Particular attention is requested to the instructions, regarding rough working and loose sheets of paper printed on the answer books. All rough working must be shown on the left hand page of the answer books themselves against the respective answer. *The*

number of each question as given in the question paper should be noted both in the margin and in the centre of the page of the answer book just above the respective answer. No separate books for rough working will be supplied to candidates. Papers must not be detached from the answer books of candidates. If the ordinary answer books are found insufficient, additional books will be allowed and these should be securely fastened to the answer books.

12. When candidates have finished writing their answers, and wish to give up their answer books, or at the end of the period prescribed for each particular parts of the examination, each should stand up in his place and remain standing until one of the superintendents has gone up to him and has received his answer book from him.

13. Candidates sitting for the examinations at the different centres should apply to the Chief Superintendent of the respective centre for their hall tickets three days before the commencement of the respective examinations. Any particulars noted in the hall ticket differing from those given in the application for the examination should be immediately reported to the Chief Superintendent by the concerned candidate.

It will not be permissible for candidates to sit for the examination at a centre other than that mentioned in the applications without the special permission of the University. No permission for change of centre will be granted after the applications are registered.

14. Candidates appearing at centres where they are not known must be prepared to satisfy the Chief Superintendents of such centres as to their identity. They shall also be required to place their signatures upon the identification certificates produced by them before the Chief Superintendents of the respective centres. The officer from whom the identification certificate is produced shall however be the Principal of a college or a Government officer of rank not less than that of a Sub-Magistrate.
