#### SCHOOL EXAMINATION BOARD, NORTH ORISSA.

##### NOTICE.

Candidates who desire permission to appear as private candidates at the Final Examinations 1937 of Elementary Training Schools, should submit their applications on or before the 16th August 1937, to the Headmasters of the Elementary Training Schools where they were originally trained. Applications should be in English and in the accompanying form. Candidates who have completed 18 months' teaching in a recognised school after appearing at a previous examination must submit with their applications a certificate to that effect from the Sub-Inspector or Deputy Inspector of Schools in whose jurisdiction the school is situated. Such a certificate is not necessary in the case of candidates who failed at the examination but passed the practical test. The Headmaster of the Elementary Training School concerned will check the entries in the applications and forward them to the Deputy or District Inspector of Schools on or before the 23rd August 1937.

2. The Deputy or District Inspector of Schools will please see carefully that all the particulars are correctly given and forward the applications to the undersigned on or before the 2nd September 1937, with his remarks as to the eligibility of each candidate.

3. A fee of Rs. 2-8-0 will be charged from each candidate who is considered eligible by the Deputy or District Inspector of Schools. The chalan showing the deposit of the fee in the treasury should be sent with the application. No application will be considered unless, it is accompanied with the chalan.

## NOTICE TO PUBLISHERS.

To carry out fully and intelligently the New Primary School syllabus of North Orissa a new Teachers' Handbook of Method and Organisation was planned before the separation of Bihar and Orissa. This was to be in the form of separate sections by specialists on their subjects, but published uniformly on paper of royal octavo size so that they could be kept together in a container. Under this system it will be possible to replace cheaply any particular section when a better work is forthcoming. The sections required are given below. 2. A handbook for the teaching of the geography of Orissa and India for classes IV and V, as notified before in the *Orissa Gazette* of the 18th June 1937.

3. Sectional Handbooks on Method and Organisation:—

(a) Physical training, games and drill;

(b) Handwork and drawing;

(c) Needlework and adaptations of the syllabus for girls' schools.

4. Outlines of requirements for all sections of the Handbook of Method and Organisation may be had from the Director of Public Instruction, Orissa, on payment of Re. 1. Outlines for the other handbooks may also be had from the same at a price of Re. 1 each.

5. Two special kinds of reading books for boys and girls in classes IV and V are also required and drafts may be submitted to the Orissa Text-Book Committee for approval—

(1) A Geographical Reader containing also matter connected with village uplift and agriculture.

(2) A Historical Reader.

Outlines of the required contents of these two types of readers can be obtained at Re. 1 from the Director of Public Instruction, Orissa.
