GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report light rain fell in Balliguda Taluk of district Ganjam. There was no rain in the rest of the Province. The harvesting and the threshing of *saradh* paddy are in progress. Transplantation of *dalua* paddy is going on in the Cuttack and the Puri districts. Planting of sugarcane continues in the Cuttack district and its harvesting and pressing are going on. Sowing of *mung*, *mandia* and *china* continues in the Puri district. Transplantation of tobacco is going on in the Cuttack district. The harvesting of redgram, *gingelly* and turmeric continues in the Ganjam district and that of *niger*, greengram, and mustard in the Koraput district. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice is 18.86 seers a rupee against 18.90 seers for the preceding week in North Orissa and stationary at 14.33 seers in South Orissa. The figures for North and South Orissa for the corresponding period of last year are 15.39 and 14.03 seers a rupee respectively. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Puri and Sambalpur districts.
