EIGHTEENTH CONVOCATION, NOVEMBER 1944

The Eighteenth Convocation for conferring degrees and titles will be held on Saturday the 18th November 1944 at 3.30 P.M. in the Assembly Hall of the Andhra Christian College, Gunupur.

Applications from candidates for degrees or titles in the prescribed form should be made so as to reach the Registrar not later than Thursday, the 2nd November 1944. Printed forms of application for the purpose can be obtained from the University office on application made in person, or by post. Each requisition for an application form should be followed by an addressed and stamped envelope. Special forms of applications are available for candidates taking their degrees in absentia. Candidates should state, when writing for forms, whether they wish to take the degrees in person or in absentia at the Convocation.

Every candidate for a degree should appear in person at the Convocation to receive the same. A candidate desirous of being exempted from appearance in person shall not receive his diploma except on payment of a fee of Rs 10. The fee should be paid into a Government treasury or into a branch of the Imperial Bank of India, and the receipt therefor should be submitted to this office enclosed to the application for admission to the Convocation. In the case of those residing outside the Madras Presidency, the fee should be sent by money order to the Registrar.

Applications not prepared in the prescribed form, or defective in any particular, or received after the prescribed date, are liable to be rejected. Candidates are advised, as a safeguard against the miscarriage or non-delivery of application, to submit them much earlier than the prescribed date. Enquiries from the candidates as to the receipt of their applications in the office of the Registrar will not

receive attention; but applications accompanied by addressed post cards will be acknowledged by the return of the latter with the University stamp duly impressed thereon.

Cards of admission to the Convocation will be issued on Saturday, the 11th November, to the address given in the application form. Candidates should give clearly the address to which those should be sent. Candidates for degrees or titles who either do not receive cards of admission in time after the above date of posting or who find their names on the admission cards differing from those given in their applications are requested to communicate the fact to the Registrar and to take a duplicate card of admission in person at the office of the Registrar a day before the date of Convocation. *No candidate will be admitted into the Convocation Hall without a ticket of admission.*

Candidates for degrees or titles are requested to be in the Convocation Hall at least one hour before the time fixed for the Convocation. *They are required by the regulations to wear the correct gowns and hoods pertaining to their respective degrees.*

Candidates who, having sent their applications to the Registrar notifying that they would attend the Convocation to take their degrees or titles, fail to appear thereat will be charged an extra fee of Rs. 10 each when they next apply for their degrees or titles.

The following are the academic robes prescribed for the several degrees. Candidates intending to take their degrees in person are advised to make arrangements in advance to obtain the correct academic robes:—

Bachelors of Arts (Pass or Honours) or Commerce (Pass or Honours) or Science (Pass or Honours) or Education or Medicine—

(a) A gown made of black stuff cut like the Cambridge B.A. gown.

(b) A hood made of black silk or stuff edged inside with three-inch wide lining of crimson colour for Arts, russet brown for Commerce, white for Science, yellow (canary) for Education and pale blue (Cambridge blue) for Medicine.

Masters (excluding those in surgery) of Arts or Science or Education—

(a) A gown made of black stuff cut like the Cambridge B.A. gown.

(b) A hood made of black silk with full lining of crimson colour for Arts, white for Science and yellow (canary) for Education.

Ph.Ds. in Arts—

(a) A black gown same as for Cambridge M.A. faced with silk of crimson colour.

(b) A hood made of scarlet cloth with three-inch wide lining of crimson colour.

Doctors of Science or Medicine and Masters in Surgery—

(a) A scarlet stuff gown faced with silk of white colour for Science and pale blue (Cambridge blue) for Doctors of Medicine or Masters in Surgery.

(b) A scarlet cloth hood fully lined with silk of white colour for Science and pale blue (Cambridge blue) for Doctors of Medicine or Masters in Surgery.

Titles in Oriental Learning—

A gown similar to that for the B.A. degree made of grey stuff overlaid with shawl border in the form of an Uttariya.
