GOVERNMENT OF ORISSA.

EDUCATION, HEALTH AND LOCAL SELF-GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT.

RESOLUTION.

Dated Cuttack, the 3rd July 1937.

Different syllabuses are in use in the elementary training schools in North and South Orissa and there are defects in them especially in the important matter of child study and handling of very small children. The Government of Orissa have therefore decided to appoint a small committee of officials to consider and report on the question of the introduction of a uniform syllabus in all higher elementary or middle training schools in Orissa.

The committee will consist of the following members:—

- (i) Principal, Cuttack Training College.
- (ii) Headmasters of the Secondary Training Schools at Cuttack and Berhampur.
- (iii) One officer with experience of a District Inspector of Schools } to be nominated by the Divisional Inspector of Schools,
- (iv) One Deputy Inspector of Schools } North Orissa.
- (v) One senior Deputy Inspector of Schools nominated by the District Educational Officer, Ganjam.
- (vi) Mr. S. C. Mahapatra, Assistant Professor, Training College, Cuttack
—*Secretary*.

The terms of reference of the Committee will be—

- (a) to consider the syllabuses at present in use in the middle and higher elementary training schools of North and South Orissa respectively, together with the syllabus approved by the Government of Bihar and Orissa for a two-year course and to draw up a syllabus which could be used uniformly in all higher elementary or middle training schools in Orissa when the two-year course is introduced in North Orissa ;
- (b) pending the introduction of this new syllabus, to consider what changes are necessary in the syllabus in use in higher elementary training schools in South Orissa in order to make it more useful especially in the matter of dealing with very small children ;
- (c) to consider the examinations now conducted at the end of the training courses and to make recommendations consonant with recommendations on the syllabus. The question of an examination in practical work of various sorts should be carefully studied ;
- (d) to consider the advisability of providing for instruction being given in the training schools in Agriculture and cattle breeding and the appointment of a trained graduate or degree holder in Agriculture in place of one of the ordinary teachers of the schools.

ORDER.—Ordered that the resolution be published in the *Orissa Gazette* and that copies be forwarded to the Director of Public Instruction, Orissa, and the Director of Development, Orissa.

GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the Province. The fall was heavy in districts Cuttack, Puri, Sambalpur and in parts of district Koraput. The rivers Mahanadi, Kathjori, Brahmani and Baitarani are in flood. The puddling and transplantation of *saradh* paddy and the weeding of *biali* paddy are in progress. In some parts of district Cuttack *biali* paddy is in ears. Ragi is being transplanted in the Cuttack and Ganjam districts. The weather conditions were favourable for the jute crop except in the Bhadrak subdivision of the Balasore district. *Til* is thriving in the Cuttack and Puri districts, *arhar* and maize in the Puri district and cotton in the Cuttack district. The condition of sugarcane is fair. Fodder is reported to be sufficient everywhere except in the flooded areas of the Cuttack district. Water is sufficient in all districts. The average price of local common rice was stationary at 15.29 seers a rupee in North Orissa and was 12.20 seers a rupee against 12.34 seers in the preceding week in South Orissa. The figures for North and South Orissa for the corresponding week of last year are 13.27 and 11.08 seers. Cattle disease is reported from parts of the Cuttack, Balasore, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.
