NOTICE FOR CALLING TENDERS.

1. Sealed tenders on plain paper, to be eventually drawn in Public Works Department form no. H will be received up to 3 P.M. on Monday, the 20th November 1939, by the undersigned for the work of supplying materials for the Flood damage repairs to Embankment no. 83-B near the crossing of Embankment no. 84-B and will be opened in the presence of the tenderers or their authorised agents.
2. Tenderers should state the period within which they can complete the work commencing from the date of the receipt of written order to commence the work.
3. Tenderers are required to deposit earnest money at the rate of Rs. 100 for every 5,000, or part thereof, on the amount of the tender. The earnest money is to be deposited into a Government treasury with a chalan in duplicate, one copy of which is to be submitted with the tender. No cheque will be accepted.
4. (a) The estimate, plan and specification for the work can be seen at the office of the Executive Engineer, Northern Division and the Subdivisional Officer, Cuttack Embankment Subdivision.
(b) All other information can be obtained on application to the undersigned.
5. Authority is reserved to reject any or all of the tenders received, and no reason for the rejection of all or any of the tenders will be given.
6. The earnest money of the successful tenderer, which accompanies the tender, will be forfeited in case he declines to sign the agreement or contract, or to deposit security within ten days of being called upon to do so, after the acceptance of his tender.
7. The amount of estimate is Rs. 7,000 approximately.
8. Each tender (except in the case of lump sum contracts) must take the form of a definite quotation of rate for each item of work to be included in the contract. If contractors use indefinite terms, such as "at estimated rates, etc." their tenders will not be considered.

WANTED

Only thirty candidates to undergo one year's training for the present in the Basic Training School, Bari, in the interior of the district of Cuttack with effect from the 2nd January 1940 on a monthly stipend of Rs. 10 each.

2. *Minimum qualification required:* A pass in the Matriculation or S. S. L. C. examination. Preference will be given to men with teaching or higher qualifications and who have done some constructive social or national work, know spinning, gardening, rowing, music, indigenous games or treatment of common simple village diseases. Candidates possessing sanskrit title qualification and at the same time having knowledge of other subjects up to the Matriculation standard may apply.

3. Candidates are required, at the time of admission, to execute an agreement binding them to complete the prescribed course of training to the satisfaction of the Head Master of the training school and to abide by the rules of the school and hostel and to serve as teachers of the basic schools for at least three years after completion of the course, if required.

to do so. Students after one year's training will be sent for two years' practical training in the basic schools on the pay mentioned below and then recalled for one year's refresher course in the training school.

4. It is needless to point out that none need apply who has no faith in the scheme of basic national education, cannot put forth hard and strenuous manual labour, is unwilling to do social service and sanitation work and cannot adapt himself to difficulties peculiar to mufasils in the interior. Common messing arrangement is available for 30 students. It is necessary, for convenient attendance in all the activities of the school, to put up in the dormitory. The inmates of the hostel do their own scavenging.

5. Candidates are required to appear at an interview and an entrance examination at their own expenses. They will be informed of the exact time and place or the purpose later on.
