GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report light rain fell in Nawapara and Nowrangapur subdivisions. Threshing of *saradh* paddy is in progress in districts Cuttack, Puri and Sambalpur. Its harvesting is nearing completion in district Balasore. *Dalua* paddy is thriving in districts Cuttack and Puri. Harvesting and pressing of sugarcane continue in all the districts of the province. Mustard and tobacco are being harvested in district Koraput and *biri* and *kulthi* in district Cuttack and in parts of Puri district. *Jhain mung* is being sown in Cuttack district. Mango is in flowers at certain places in Cuttack district. Vegetables are doing well. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice was 18.38 seers a rupee against 18.69 seers for the preceding week in North Orissa. It remained stationary at 13.63 seers in South Orissa. The figures for North and South Orissa for the corresponding period of last year are 15.88 and 11.87 seers a rupee respectively. Cattle disease is reported from parts of districts Cuttack and Puri.
