Pasture available; fodder sufficient. Condition of men and cattle generally good. Labour available. Stock of food grains sufficient. Prospects fair. Outturn fair. Water sufficient. Cattle disease—rinder pest in parts of Malkanagiri and Pottangi taluks. Stock of food grains sufficient. Prospects normal. Common rice selling at 13 seers a rupee at Jajpur and 10 seers at Parlakimedi and Gunupur.

GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report rain fell in all the districts of the Province. The fall was heavy in parts of Puri district and light to moderate elsewhere. *Laghu saradh* paddy is ripening and its harvesting continues in Cuttack, Puri and Ganjam districts. *Guru saradh* paddy is in ears and flowers. Harvesting of groundnut is proceeding in Ganjam and Koraput districts. Sowing of mustard, castor, *mung*, *til*, and horesgram continues. Paddy, sugarcane, cotton and vegetables are thriving. Paddy crop is expected to be good this year. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 14.70 seers a rupee against 14.83 seers for the preceding week. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Puri, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.

GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report light rain fell in parts of Cuttack, Ganjam and Koraput districts. There was no rain in the rest of the Province. Harvesting of *laghu saradh* paddy continues. *Guru saradh* paddy is ripening. Harvesting of groundnut is proceeding in Ganjam district. Sowing of mustard, castor, *til* and horsegram continues. Paddy, sugarcane, *biri*, redgram and vegetables are thriving. Paddy crop is expected to be good this year. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 14.70 seers a rupee against the same figure for the preceding week. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Puri, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.
