GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report heavy rain fell in parts of Ganjam districts. The fall was light to moderate elsewhere. Harvesting of *beali* paddy still continues in Balasore and Sambalpur districts. *Laghu saradh* paddy is in ears and flowers and it is ripening at places in Balasore and Puri districts. Harvesting of light paddy and groundnut is in progress in Ganjam district and that of groundnut and *sama* in Koraput district. Sowing of castor, *mung* and mustard is going on. Cotton and *til* are in flowers and pods in Cuttack district. Transplantation of tobacco is going on in Rayaghada taluk of Koraput district. Sugarcane, paddy and gingelly are thriving. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 14 seers a rupee against 13.90 seers for the preceding week. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Puri, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.

The fall was heavy in parts of Ganjam district and light to moderate elsewhere. Harvesting of *beali* paddy still continues in Balasore district. *Laghu saradh* paddy is in ears and flowers and is ripening at places in Cuttack, Balasore and Puri districts. Harvesting of light paddy continues in Sambalpur, Ganjam and Koraput districts. Sowing of mustard, castor, *kulthi* and *biri* is going on. Paddy, sugarcane, cotton and vegetables are thriving. Paddy crop is expected to be good this year. Transplantation of tobacco continues in Rayaghada taluk of Koraput district. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 14.83 seers a rupee against 14 seers for the preceding week. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Puri, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.
