1	CUTTACK ..	10.86	13 1/8	13 1/8	Rainfall at Jajpur 0.90 and at Angul 0.24 inch. Weather stormy and cyclonic accompanied by heavy rainfall. Its effect on agricultural operations not so favourable and on crops beneficial. <i>Saradh</i> paddy, sugarcane, <i>arhar</i> , cotton and <i>til</i> thriving. <i>Biri</i> and <i>kulthi</i> being sown and germinating at places. Vegetables doing well. Fodder and water sufficient. Cattle disease reported from Tangi police-station. Common rice selling at 13 3/4 seers a rupee at Jajpur and 16 1/4 seers at Angul. Report from Kendrapara not received.
2	BALASORE ..	1.92	13	13	Rainfall at Bhadrak 0.25 inch. Weather cloudy. Paddy plants growing. Weeding almost finished. Harvesting of <i>beali</i> paddy going on. Sugarcane and vegetables thriving well. No cattle disease reported. Fodder and water sufficient. Common rice selling at 15 seers a rupee at Bhadrak.

Fodder and water sufficient. Cattle disease reported from Bolgarh and Jatni police-stations. Common rice selling at 15 3/4 seers a rupee at Khurda.

Harvesting and threshing of at-paddy, harvesting of <i>kauriu</i> , maize and sowing of <i>mung</i> in progress. Condition of standing crops good. Common rice selling at 16 7/8 seers a rupee at Bargarh, and 12 seers at Nawapara. Cattle disease reported from Barpali and Jagdalpur thanas.

Littoral paddy first sort 1.93, second sort 1.72, boiled rice 2.95, raw rice 3.90, ragi 2.04, horsegram 2.05 and salt 2.39. (prices in rupees and decimals of a rupee to two places per Imperial maund of 3,200 tolas). Common rice selling at 12 seers a rupee at Khondmals. Raw rice selling at 9.63 seers a rupee at Chatrapur. Water-supply sufficient for drinking and agricultural operations in all taluks. Sowing of green gram and gingelly in Surada taluk is nearing completion. Weeding operations continue in Aska and Surada taluks. Sugarcane in Khondmals; samai, paddy, maize, ragi and redgram in G. Udayagiri; paddy, ragi sugarcane in Ghumsur; paddy, redgram, sugarcane in Surada; paddy, sugarcane, ragi, red and black grams in Aska; paddy, ragi and sugarcane in Kudala; <i>kuhuri</i> ; ragi, redgram and paddy in Balliguda; paddy, gingelly and groundnut in Berhampur taluq—progressing. Extent appreciable. Condition fair. The harvest of ragi is proceeding in Ghumsur, Surada, Kudala, Chatrapur, Ghumsur and Berhampur taluks. Outturn 6 annas. Harvest of gingelly in Ghumsur taluks—proceeding—outturn 4 annas. Pasture available; fodder sufficient. Condition of men and cattle generally good. Labour available. Stock of food grains sufficient. Prospects fair. Reservoir at Russellkonda 46.95 feet and at Surada 28.10 feet.

6	KORAPUT ..	Nil.	14.2	12	Rainfall at Nowrangapur 0.27 and at Rayaghada 0.03 inch. Weather seasonable and favourable to agricultural operations. Sowing of green gram, horsegram, and black gram proceeding in two taluks. Standing crops—paddy, sugarcane, <i>ragi</i> , <i>niger</i> and <i>sama</i> thriving generally. Groundnut harvest proceeding in Parlakimedi taluk. Out-turn fair. Water sufficient. Fodder available. Cattle disease—rinderpest—in Malkanagiri, food and mouth disease in parts of Jeypore and Pottangi taluk. Stock of food grains sufficient. Prospects normal. Jeypore exporting rice heavily. Common rice selling at 13 seers a rupee at Jeypore and 10 seers at Gunupur and Parlakimedi.

GENERAL SUMMARY.—During the week under report heavy rain fell in parts of Cuttack, Puri and Sambalpur districts. The fall was light to moderate elsewhere. Weather was stormy and cyclonic accompanied by heavy rainfall in the Cuttack district. Weeding of *saradh* paddy still continues in Puri and Ganjam districts. Harvesting of *biati* paddy is going on in Balasore, Puri and Sambalpur districts. Sowing of green gram continues in Sambalpur, Puri and Ganjam districts. Paddy, harvesting of *ragi* continues in Puri and Ganjam districts. Harvesting of *til* is going on in Puri and Ganjam districts. Supply of fodder and water is reported to be sufficient. Harvesting of *arhar* and groundnut are thriving. The average price of local common rice at headquarters markets is 13.98 seers a rupee against 13.34 seers for the preceding week. Cattle disease is reported from parts of Cuttack, Puri, Sambalpur and Koraput districts.
