No. 9449-M.—Owing to the death of Her late Royal Highness the Princess Louise Duchess of Argyll, Court Mourning is ordered

for two weeks from Sunday, the 3rd December 1939, and ending Saturday, the 16th December 1939.

When attending the Viceregal Court, during the period of Court Mourning, Ladies will appear in black or white or black and white, or grey.

Court Mourning will not be observed by the Navy, Army and Air Force, apart from the officers who are serving on the Personal Staff, except that Officers of the three services will not attend Balls during the period of Court Mourning.

2. The Flag over the Viceroy's House and those over Provincial Government Houses and other Government buildings in India will be half-masted on the day of the funeral of Her late Royal Highness.
