JOINT PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

Applications are invited for the post of an Assistant Civil Supplies Officer in the scale of pay of Rs. 165—7—200 a month. The post is a temporary and is of a gazetted rank.

2. Candidates must at least be graduates of a recognised University or must already be holding a post of Supervisor of Supplies in the Civil Supplies Department of Orissa. None need apply who is not an Oriya or a person domiciled in Orissa.

3. Applications must be made to the Secretary, Joint Public Service Commission, P. O. Hinno, Ranchi, in the prescribed form so as to reach him on or before the 28th March 1945. Copies of the form may be obtained from the Secretary. Candidates already in Government service must apply through the head of their Departments and candidates in private employment are advised to submit a recent certificate from their present employers.
