No. T.C.(17)1/45-In pursuance of sub-clause (b) of clause 10 of the Cotton Cloth and Yarn (Control) Order, 1943, I hereby direct that the maximum prices wholesale. and retail at which yarn manufactured in India may be sold shall be as specified herein.
2. The maximum price por 10 lbs . of such yarn of any description specificd in column 2 of the Schedule hereta appended shall be the ex-factory price thereof increased by the amount specified in the corresponding entry:
(a) in column 3 of the said Schedule where the yarn is sold by a person who purchased it directly from a manufacturer;
(b) in eolumn 4 of the said Schedule in other cases where the yarn is sold otherwise than in rotail quantities;
(c) in column 5 of tho said Schedule where the yarn is sold in retail quantities and sub-paragraph (a) does not apply.
3. Where the yarn is delivered elsowhere than within the town of manufacture, the seller may add to the maximum price specified in paragraph 2 the amount of the freight actually paid by him or the proportionate part thereof, as the case may be:
Provided that such additional charge shall not exceed-
(i) 4 annias for every 10 lbs where the yarn is delivered at a place situated within any of the following areas, namely:-

Madras Province,
Bombay Province,
All States situated within the Western India States Agency,

Baroda State,
All States situated within the Deccan States Ageney,
Hyderabad State,
Mysore State,
Travancore State,
Cochin State,
All Statos within the Madras States Agency ;
(ii) 10 annas for every 10 lbs . in othor cases :

Provided further that suck additional charge shall be shown separately in the sellor's invoice or cash bill, and the total amount of the bill may be rounded off to the nearest anna.
Explanation-For the purposes of this notification "ex-factory price" means the maximum ex-factóry price of the yarn specifind in the Textile Commissioner's notification No. 34.Tex. A(15)2/43, dated 3ist Decomber 1943 or the contract ex-factory price theroof whichever is less;
and yarn shall not be deemed to be sold in retail quantities unless it is sold in loose bundlos in lots of not more than 100 lbs. (and the total quantity sold to the buyer in the month does not exceed 200 lbs.).

## PAPER CONTROL (ECONOMY) ORDER, 1944

## Packing of Sewing Taread in Paper

The Government of India have decided to allow the following relazations of the provisions of the Paper Control (Economy) Order, 1944, in respect of the packing of sewing thread:-
(1) Sewing thread balls-(a) A round paper ticket or label may be attached at one end of the thread ball for indicating the trade mark, etc.
(b) A dozen thread balls may be packed in kraft or other packing and wrapping paper.
(2) Sewing thread spools and cops-(a) Paper tubes may be uscd for winding on the thread.
(b) A paper band may be used round these spools for the trade mark and other particulars.
(c) A dozen spools ray be packed in cartons. These cartons should, however, not be wrapped in paper.
(3) Seuing thread reels-(a) Cardboard boxes may be used for packing a dozen reels of sewing thread.
(4) Embroidery and crochet balls-(a) A paper strip round tle ball may be used for the trade mark and other jarticulars.
(b) A dozen balls may be wrapped in kraft or other packing and wrapping paper or packed in board boxes.
Trade mark and other particulars if necessary should bo printed on the wrapper or carton or box. No extra label is to be used on the wrappers, cartons or boxes.

For clause 13 of the said Order, the following shall be substituted:-
13. (1) Where the Textile Commissioner has specified under clause 10 the markings to be made and the time and manner of making them in respect of any class or specification of cloth or yarn-
(a) the manufacturer of, or as the casa may be the dealer in, such cloth or yarn shall cause the markings to be made thereon at the time and in the manner specified by the Textile Cummissioner ;
(b) no person other than such manufacturer or dealor shall cause the markings to be made on any such cloth or yarn;
(c) no person other than the manufacturer thereof shall have in his possession or under his control any such cloth or yarn which is not so marked, unless it be for bona fide personal requirements;
(d) no person shall alter or deface or cause or permit to be altered or defaced the markings made on any such cloth or yarn held by him othorwise than for his bona fide personal requirements;
(e) no person shall make on any cloth or yarn any other markings resembling the prescribed markings in \& manner calculatiod to mislead;
( $f$ ) no person shall have in his possession or under his control otherwise than for his bona fide personal requirements any cloth or yarn the markings whereon aro alterod or defaced or are of the character specified in paragraph (e).
(2) No manufacturer shall sell or deliver any cloth or yarn of which the maximum prices have not been specified by the Textile Commissioner under clause 10 :

Provided that a manufacturer who has applied to the Textile Commissioner for the fixation of the price of such cloth or yarn may, bofore the prices theroof are notified, deliver any such cloth or yarn marked with prices provi-
sionally sanctioned by tho appropriate momber of the Industry's Committee of the Board; and in rolation to the cluth or yar. so deli.orud, lic pricis martied shall be deemed to have beon fixed under this Order.

Explanation-Nothing in this sub-clause applies to a manufacturer who does not manufacture any yarn and who had in his possession or under his control not more than 24 power looms on the lst January 1944, or to any person engaged solely in any process ancillary to the production of cloth or yara.

No. 91-M(9)/45-In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-rule (2) of rule 81 of the Defence of India Rules, tho Central Government is pleased to make the following Order :-
l. (1) This Order may be called the Aluminium Utensils (Control) Order, 1945.
(2) It extends to the whole of British India.
(3) It shall come into force on the lst March 1945.
2. In this Order, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject of context,-
(a) "dealer" means any person carrying on the business of selling aluminium utensils whether wholesalu or retail, and whether or not in conjunction with any other business
(b). " manufacturer" means any person carrying on the business of manufacturing aluminium utensils ;
(c) "Schedule" moans a Schedule appended to this Order.
3. Every manufacturer shall stamp on all aluminium utensils sold, despatched or delived by him on or after the lst March 1945, the maximum retail price per lb. of the utensils as given in Schedule I and his brand.
4. Every manufacturer to whom aluminium is released under an approved scheme of the Central Govern-ment-
(i) shall manufacture therefrom only utensils of the description specified in Schodule I ;
(ii) shall submit to the Secretary to the Government of India in the Department of Industries and Civil Supplies a true monthly return in the form shown in schedule II so as to reach him not later than the 10th of each month;
(iii) shall comply with the directions of the Central Government or of an officer authorited by the Central Government as to the distribution of such utensil among dealers.
5. (1) No dealer shall sell any aluminium utensil at price higher than the maximum retail price of the utensil as determined by the provisions of Schedule I.
(2) No dealer shall after the 31 st March 1945 sell any aluminium utensil on which the maximum retail price per lb. as given in Schedule I and the brand of the manufacturer have not been stamped.
6. Every dealer shall prominently display in his shop a true copy of Schedule I, keep it amended up to date and allow it to be examined by any customer who wishes. to refer to it:
7. Any officer authorised by the Central Government in this behalf may, with a view to securing compliance with this Order,-
(a) require any manufacturer or dealer to give any information in his possession with respect to his business;
(b) inspect or cause to bo inspected any books or other documents belonging to or undor the control of any manufacturer or dealer;
(c) enter and search, or authorise any person to enter and search any premises, and seize, or authorize any person to seize, any articles in respoct of which he has reason to believe that a contravention of this Order has been or is likely to be committed.
8. The Central Government may by general or special' order exempt any person or class of persons from all or any of the provisions of this Order.
9. Any Court trying 2 contravention of this Order may withouc projudive to any sentence which it may pass, Mrect that any utensils in respect of which the Court is satisfied that the Order has been contravened sball be forfeited to His Majesty.

1. (i) This Order may be called the Footwear Control Order, 1945.
(2) It extends to the whole of British India.
(3) It shall come into force at once.
2. In this Order, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context :-
(a) "ceiling price" in relation to footwear of any description means the price shown in the Schedules to this Order as the ceiling price for footwear of that description;
(b) "cottage manufacturer"' means a person who manufactures footwear for sale through a factor;
(c) "factor" means a person, other than' a manufacturer, who carries on the business of purchasing footwear manufactured by cottage manufacturers for resale to retailers;
(d) "footwear" means any article of footwear made wholly or partly of leather, including chappals and sandals, or such other footwear specifically included in the Schedules to this Order ;
(e) "manufacturer" means a person who manufactures footwear for sale otherwise than through a factor;
(f) "price" means price per pair of the footwear;
(g) "retailer" means a person other than a manufacturer or impoiter who carries on the business of selling any footwear otherwise than for the purpose of resale ;
( $h$ ) "Schedule" means a Schedule annesed to this Order.
3. The provisions of this Order shall not apply in relation to :-
(a) footwear imported from outside India;
(b) footwear specially made to measure for a particular person for his own use;
(c) footwear, other than those mentioned in the Schedules, the retail price of which is less than three rupees; and

## FIXATION OF TATLORING CHARGES Controller General Clarifies Position Bombay, 13th February 1945

The exact purpose and significance of the Department of Industries and Civil Supplies Notification issued under section 3 of the Hoarding and Profiteering Prevention Ordinance and publishod in the Gazette of India, dated the 18th November 1944, fixing tailoring charges have not beon understood. It is, therefore, stated that these tailoring charges apply only to those establishments which have obtained authority under tho appropriate section of the Ordinanco for refusal to sell cloth by the yard and for supply of ready-made garments. The notification does not apply to those doalers who receive cloth and levy only tailoring charges for the garments made by them. Rates charged by such dealers aro expected to be very much lower than those fixed for ' C ' class establishment under the notification referred to above.

(2) Oifeers who haye held posts listed in the Scaedule to this Article may be granted an additional pension (a) at the rate of Kr. 300 for each completieci year of efective scrvice in any post included in the lower grade, and (b) at the rate of Ths. $\overline{5} C 0$ for each commeied year of effective service in any post inclucied in the upper grade, up to a maximum of Rs. 1,500 per annum for service in lower grade appointments and Rs. 2,500 per annum for service in lower and upper grade appointments combined or in upper grade appointments alone. Provided that in the cass of an officer who has earned an additional pension by service in appointments in both the upper cund lower grades, service for any broken period of a year in the: upper grade may count as service in the lower grade if lis pension would be thereby increased.
