JOINT PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

GAZETTE

Applications are invited for the post of an Assistant Disease Investigation Officer (sheep and goats) for Orissa on a scale of pay of Rs. 200-15-275 a month The post has been created for the present for a period of three years up to 31st March 1948.

2. The candidate must be a graduate of a recognised Indian Veterinary College with post-graduate training at the Imperial Vetorinary Research Institute. He should possess extensive field and practical experience in sheep and goat husbandry and control of their diseases. Every thing being equal preference may be given to a candidate who is a native of the Province or domiciled therein. A knowledge of Oriya will be considered an additional qualifi-The selected candidate after appointment will be cation required to receive special training for such periods and at such places as may be considered necessary. He will be required to join his duties immediately on appointment.

3. Applications should be made to the Secretary, Joint Public Service Commission, P. O. Hinno, Ranchi, in the prescribed form so as to reach him on or before the 20th April 1945. Candidates who are in Government service should apply through the heads of their Departments. Candidates in private employment should produce recent certificates from their employers.

4. Applications must be accompanied by certificates in original showing the candidates' qualifications, character and domicile; the nature and extent of his previous experience; and by evidence of age, which should ordinarily be the Matriculation certificate or its equivalent, in original. A candidate claiming to be domiciled in Orissa, must produce a domiciled cortificate from the District Officer of the district in which he claims to be domiciled.

5. Every application must be accompained by a treasury challan of Rs. 5 as application fee. Secretary, Joint Public Service Commission for Bihar, the Central Provinces and Berar, and Orissa, P. O. Hinoo, Ranchi, invites applications on or before the 7th April 1945, on the prescribed form, which along with the full particulars, may be obtained from him for selection of about thirty students for foreign training as part of the post-war reconstruction scheme of the Government of Orissa. It is expected that about twenty students will be fully sponsored by Government and their expenses wholly met from public revenue. Ten students will probably be sent with financial assistance from the Loan Stipend Fund to the extent of two-thirds of the total expenditure. Candidates should be between 18 and 25 years of age on the 1st August 1945. They should be natives of Orissa or Orissa States, or domiciled therein or children of Government servants serving in Orissa. Candidates will normally be expected to be graduates of Indian Universities but candidates with special qualifications which would make them eligible for admission to foreign Universities (e.g., Senior Cambridge with distinction or I.Sc. first class) will also be considered. The list of subjects which the Government have in view are Mechanical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Civil Engineering-Bridges-Dams, Commercial Engineering, Architecture-Regional Planning-Building Construction, Applied Chemistry (Industrial Chemistry), Leather Technology, Textile Technology, Glass Technology, Fuel Engineering, Municipal and Sanitary Engineering, Sugar Technology, Pottery, Paper Technology, Industrial Educa-tion for qualifying as Principals of Technical High Schools, Canaral Agriculture for this and didates should referrable General Agriculture (for this candidates should preferably be graduates in Agriculture; failing that graduates in Science will be considered).
