AGRICULTURAL TRAINING

20 stipends of Rs. 30 each a month plus an additional stipend of Rs. 5 due to increased cost of living tenable at the following Agricultural Colleges, will be offered to Oriyas and those domiciled in Orissa:—

Coimbatore, Nagpur, Allahabad, Balwant Rajpur College, Agra and Khalasa College, Amritsar.

Minimum qualifications—I.Sc. for the Coimbatore College and Matriculation with Science as an optional subject for the four latter colleges. Preference will be given to candidates with higher qualifications and Agricultural bias. Candidates must be below 21 years on the 1st July 1945.

AGRICULTURAL TRAINING

Applications are invited from candidates for the training of 50 sub-overseers and 100 fieldmen. All the sub-overseers and 50 fieldmen will be trained at the Cuttack Farm and the remaining fieldmen will be trained at Sambalpur, Balia, Kujang and Khurda Farms and at Berhampur Rice Research Station.

Duration of training—One year for the sub-overseers and six months for the fieldmen. The training will commence in July 1945.

Minimum qualification for admission—(a) Matriculation or S. S. L. C. for sub-overseer training. Candidates must have agricultural bias.
