SPECIAL CONDITION OF SALE, BARAPAHAR DIVISION

Part II

1. Bamboo, Sonari, Dumkurudu and Khair (*Accacia catechu*) shall not be allowed to be felled, extracted or sold from the coppice coupes of the year by the coppice coupe contractors.
2. Debris, i.e., small wood should be piled closely between the lines pegged to a height of 3' and a width of 3' for rab sowing. The names of coupes in which this collection will be required to be done by the purchasers of the coupe together with the length of line over which such debris are to be collected will be notified at the time of sale.
3. Divisional Forest Officer, Barapahar Division, reserves the right of altering the dates of payment of any instalment as mentioned in Part III in the case of any coupe.
4. Ordinarily no extension of time for working of the coupe will be allowed.
5. The lessee shall be bound to supply within the time as will be specified by the Divisional Forest Officer from the trees purchased by him, such timber as may be specified by the Divisional Forest Officer, to be required for war purpose. The supply to be made at such Railway or other Depot as the Divisional Forest Officer may decide. Payment for such timber will be made at rates fixed by

the Supply Department, provided the Divisional Forest Officer may in fulfilment of a contract undertaken by the Forest Department require the lessee to supply such timber to the Forest Department at a rate of one anna in the rupee less than the rate fixed by the Supply Department.

6. The bidders whose bids are accepted provisionally or finally by the Divisional Forest Officer will immediately on the fall of the hammer have to sign the agreement and deposit security in the Post Office, as laid down in condition 8 of the general condition of sale. Part II provided (i) that new contractors, i.e. those who did not work as forest contractor will be required to deposit security amounting to 25 per cent of the sale price, (ii) that for all bamboo coupes 25 per cent of the purchase price will have to be deposited as security.

7. Trimmed bamboos must be collected on paid labour by the contractor under supervision of approved agents. Untrimmed bamboos may be cut and collected by the purchasers but under the supervision of approved agents of the Contractor.

8. If any successful contractor neglects to produce the required War Board timber according to the direction of the Divisional Forest Officer, the Divisional Forest Officer will be at liberty to produce them from the coupe departmentally at the contractor's risk.

9. The purchaser will be bound to sell the produce from his own coupe to the bona fide residents of the district for their own consumption at a rate not exceeding the revised schedule of rates for Sambalpur and Barapahar Divisions, plus the actual cost of collection.

10. The Divisional Forest Officer, Barapahar Division, has the power to terminate any contract for supply of war timbers absolutely on the expiration of the period of three months from the date on which notice of intention to terminate such contract has been served on the contractor by the Divisional Forest Officer, Barapahar Division.
